FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Sometime in 2009 or early in 2010 the father of my friend Msgr. Ted Wojcicki passed away. In his homily at the Funeral Mass, Monsignor recalled the times during his childhood when he would pass by his parents bedroom and see his dad kneeling at the bed, hands folded in prayer. My thoughts immediately went to my own dad, who died in December 2010. My father had to rise early for work, so he went to bed while us kids were still up. And if you walked by the bedroom there he would be, kneeling alongside the bed, rosary in hand, praying at the conclusion of a day, undoubtedly mentioning each one of his children to God, relying

on the intercession of our Blessed Mother.

In the homily of my father's Funeral Mass, I also, like my friend, mentioned the impression I had when I saw my dad on his knees, devoutly praying. Maybe, I suggested, there would be an increase in priestly vocations if more sons saw their dads at prayer within the family home.

An unknown poet penned these words:

To hear my child at prayer, What a thrill it is for me! There's a sweetness in the moment As he speaks on bended knee. And yet my heart is smitten At this touching sight I see, Has his faith and trust in prayer Depended much on me? As I see him fold his tiny hands And bow his head to pray, I trust he'll always love the Lord The way he does today. Then I hear a voice within me Speak in solemn words and true, "How he lives a life of prayer Depends a lot on you." And so I kneel next to the bed, And lay my hand upon him. After he has voiced his prayer, I add my own petition. May my son recall one day That his father daily raised His voice to thank the Lord And make sacrifice of praise!

The late New York governor Mario Cuomo said, "I talk and talk, and I haven't taught people in 50 years what my father taught by example in one week." Father's Day presents the opportunity for each one of us to remember the goodness of dads, either by prayer for those of us whose fathers have passed on to the Lord, or by affection and gifts for those whose fathers are here on Earth. We can't forget, though, that this holiday presents a challenge to all dads, (including those in a vocation where they are addressed as 'Father'), to set a good example, especially in the realm of faith. Dedication to Christ, reliance upon the prayers of the Virgin Mary, hunger for the Eucharist, a willingness to be charitable, and loving your children's mother, are essential components for modeling what a good father should do. It's quite a challenge. No wonder, then, that dads turn to God in prayer. And, Dads, when you do, maybe now and then leave open the bedroom door as you kneel while talking to God. Who knows, maybe a future priest or religious sister will walk by and be inspired.

A Happy Father's Day to all the dads. May God bless them, and all of you.

SAINT JOACHIM (FIRST CENTURY)



St. Joachim was the husband of St. Anne, and they were the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Though older, the couple prayed to be blessed with a child.

Tradition teaches that while Joachim was away from home, an angel appeared to him in a vision. This angel promised that

he and Anne would bear a child who would be blessed through the ages. Joachim rushed home to his wife. She told him she was promised the same thing from another of God's messengers.

St. Joachim is considered the patron of fathers, grandfathers, grandparents, married couples and cabinet makers. Both he and St. Anne share the feast day of July 26, the feast of grandparents. It reminds grandparents of their responsibility for future generations and reminds young people of their elders' experience and wisdom.

Although little detail is known about St. Joachim, it's apparent the love he had for his child. It also must have been a challenge to see his girl grow up to be chosen by God to be the mother of our Savior.

SAINT JOSEPH (FIRST CENTURY)



With the apostolic letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as patron of the Universal Church. Pope Francis proclaimed a Year of St. Joseph which continues to December 8.

Pope Francis describes the foster father of Jesus as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, and obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

St. Joseph, in fact, "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home," Pope Francis wrote, quoting his predecessor St. Paul VI.

In St. Joseph, "Jesus saw the tender love of God," the one that helps us accept our weakness. St. Joseph is also a father in obedience to God; he protects Mary and Jesus and teaches his Son to "do the will of the Father," Pope Francis explained.

At the same time, St. Joseph is "an accepting father," because he "accepted Mary unconditionally" - an important gesture even today, Pope Francis wrote. Trusting in the Lord, he accepts in his life even the events that he does not understand, "setting aside his own ideas" and reconciling himself with his own history.

St. Joseph was a father in the shadows," centered on Mary and Jesus. "Fathers are not born, but made," Pope Francis wrote. "A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child."

CHURCH TEACHING ON THE EUCHARIST

The Catholic Church professes that in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.... For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:51-55). The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine - the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

"By the consecration, the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: His Body and His Blood, with His soul and His divinity" (CCC 1413).

"The Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult of adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession: (CCC1378).

All parishioners are encouraged to come and spend some time in prayer in the Presence of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

In Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18, we are asked to do three things: pray, fast, and give alms. Let's focus today on prayer. Studies show that prayer is a very common, very popular activity. Even those who profess no belief in God pray!

What is prayer, and how should we pray? Prayer is intimate communion and conversation with God. Judging from Jesus' own life, prayer is something that we ought to do often, especially at key moments of our lives.

Well, how should we pray? What does it look like? You have to pray with faith, and according to Jesus' model, you have to pray with forgiveness. The efficacy of prayer seems to depend on the reconciliation of differences.

You also have to pray with persistence. One reason that we don't receive what we want through prayer is that we give up too easily. Augustine said that God sometimes delays in giving us what we want because he wants our hearts to expand.

Finally, we have to pray in Jesus' name. In doing so, we are relying on his influence with the Father, trusting that the Father will listen to him.




