FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Is it possible to be simultaneously very happy and very angry? Can one at the same time rejoice and lament? I'm leaving this country next week. Should I go to another country as a proud American as one embarrassed by the words and actions of my fellow Americans?

I have all these conflicting feelings since the United States Supreme Court issued its decision in the case called Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, the case in which the Court's majority overturned the 1973 Roe v. Wade decision. The court struck down the ruling which allowed abortion in all fifty states.

Now, each individual state can decide if abortion will be legal in that state as well as determining the circumstances (eg. rape) under which an abortion may occur. As you know, some states, like Missouri, automatically outlawed abortion. Others, like Illinois, rushed to make sure abortions continued. Being on vacation when the Court announced its decision allowed me to hear discussions on various new channels (Fox, MSNBC, CNN) as well as NPR while in my car. Boy what a difference in thoughts and reactions! On one station all the commentators were overjoyed; on the others there was frustration and anger. Politicians, too, lined up on opposite sides of this issue and most of the media made sure that the angry side was heard more than the happy side. No surprise there.

I, of course, was very happy with the Supreme Court's decision and I agreed with the logic of their case. Yet, like you I'm sure, I found my heart breaking and my temper boiling as I listened to one person after another voice both their objections to the decision and their determination to insure that abortions are available to those who want them. I kept asking, "Are babies that bad? Is it a terrible thing when a baby is born?" Additionally, I found it distressing as so many people continued to demand abortions be available while completely ignoring the responsibility of the one who had conceived this child, and the one who helped her do it. I found their attitude very patronizing, as if they were saying, "All women are too stupid to know where babies come from, therefore, we must make abortion available." How sad is that?

One person who appeared on several news stations was Jeanne Mancini, President of the March for Life. The point she always made, even in the face of withering opposition, was that the Pro-Life people are for woman-and for the child. We respect the rights of women, she said, while also respecting the rights of the unborn child. We respect both, she insisted.

Isn't that the way it's supposed to be? Yet, in our country, and sadly, around the world, there are those who would say, "We respect the woman. Her unborn child? Maybe, maybe not. The life of the woman and her desires are important. Her unborn child? Maybe, maybe not. One person should receive all the protections the law allows. The other person? Maybe, maybe not."

This weekend the United States celebrates one of its biggest holidays, Independence Day. Many Americans will gather to celebrate and declare that the U.S.A. is the greatest country on earth but are we great-ever, when one group gets all the rights afforded, and the other group? Maybe, maybe not. Were we great when white people had freedom, but black people? Maybe, but usually not? Were we great when pioneers and settlers had freedom to do what they wanted but Native Americans? Well, maybe, but usually not? Were we proud that during World War II most Americans had freedom, but not Japanese Americans. Should we ever want to live in a country where some can do as they please while others, like the unborn, exist only on the decision of another. "If this person created, then I will be born and I will see it. If this person wants me not to see the world God made then my body will be torn to shreds before I'm born and I won't see it." How can we be a great country if both of these choices are permissible?

Jesus in today's Gospel sends his disciples forth to speak of the Kingdom with the understanding that they know "It's not about you." That's basically his instruction; don't pack a lot of stuff, don't worry about your accommodations-it's not about you. For so many people in our nation's history that was how they lived. It wasn't about them. It was about you and me. It was about preserving a nation that has so many benefits that make our life better. I'm sorry that this Court decision brings out the fury of so many who want it to be only about the unborn child who will never get to see the goodness present in these United States.

One of our parish staff retired last week. For several years Jan Schroeder has worked in the parish office. She made sure all our volunteers completed the programs necessary to protect God's children and she answered the phone and the door, always in a warm and friendly way. She was a great asset to the parish and she will be missed.

May God bless all of you.




