

This was Jesus' command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. Did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other? The moral of the story is to love our neighbor. That means loving someone you may not know, or someone that looks different that you, or someone that has different beliefs than you, or someone that you don't like. All without expecting anything in return.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Many years ago a poor man travelled into town to earn money to celebrate the approaching Feast of Easter. He worked hard at various jobs, and having been paid, he purchased many items that would be used to rejoice in the Lord's Resurrection, plenty of trinkets with which the children could play and plenty of food for his family and friends to enjoy.

He left the town after nightfall, steering his horse and the wagon laden with purchases. Unfortunately, the horse and wagon fell into a pit made swampy by the spring rains. A rich man passing by heard the poor man's cries, and ordered his own servants to extricate the poor man. The rich man even pitched in to help. It took a mighty effort, first to tie ropes from the wagon to the carriage, then to pull out the wagon and calm the poor man's now-skittish horse. Working together, though, they prevailed, and the rich man insisted on accompanying the poor man to his home, lest another accident occur.

When they arrived, the rich man was aghast at the poverty he beheld. He then resolved to add much to the poor man's purchases, not only to celebrate Easter Day, but also to lift the whole family, indeed the whole village, from such poverty. Huge was the sum of money he gave them.

When this wealthy man died and was brought before the Heavenly tribunal, it was assumed that his generosity toward the poor man and his family would vault the rich man right into Paradise, but, no. for this man had become wealthy by cheating many people. He withheld fair wages from his workers and swindled his neighbors. He had refused to pay his taxes and had never donated funds to any charity. This man, the tribunal declared, deserved to spend eternity in punishment.

Suddenly, an Angel of Mercy appeared and asked that the heavenly scales be used to determine whether the worth of his good deeds outweighed all those sins. When consent was given, the Angel placed in the scale of good deeds the poor man and his family whom the rich man had helped. It was not enough and the scales leaned toward punishment. Then the Angel put on the scale all the neighbors of the poor man. Not enough. Then the Angel added the weight of the horse and wagon pulled from the spot. Still not enough. Finally, the Angel placed on the scale the mire and mud out of which the rich man had helped rescue everybody, and at last the scales tilted in his favor and the rich man was saved from punishment. Ah, one never knows the importance of helping one another, particularly those who cannot help themselves.

Today's well-know Gospel of the Good Samaritan emphasizes this importance. It would have been easy, and in the minds of his fellow Samaritans, understandable, if he passed by the robbery victim. Even the man's fellow Jews had done so! But this Samaritan was a man of compassion and kindness and he went to extraordinary lengths to help the beating victim. His actions in the story allow Jesus to teach about the compassion all disciples should have. Such care mimics the care of Jesus for all of us and prompts Jesus to command that we "go and do likewise." May we do just that, for we don't want to need an Angel of Mercy to have to dump mud on a scale for us to get to Heaven. Our compassion for one another should make that unnecessary.

We're just three weeks away from our 50th Anniversary celebration. Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski will offer the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, July 30, followed by a dinner and video presentation at Royale Orleans. Tickets are still available. I hope to see you there.

As I mentioned in my homily last week, I will be leaving for Ireland on Thursday. It's been three years since I was last there and I'm looking forward to visiting my aunts and cousins. It's always good to be with family. Please pray for a safe journey. Know that I will be praying for you. I will return late on Sunday, July 24.



Dynamic Catholic, *Alive!* It's not Complicated

Did you ever notice that the scholars of the law, the Pharisees and the Sadducees always tried to make things complicated in order to test Jesus? Whenever they did this, what did Jesus do? He asked them a question, told them a simple story or gave them a simple answer. For instance, in today's Gospel reading a scholar asked Jesus how he could receive eternal life. Jesus answered, "What is written in the law?" This was a simple question for the scholar to answer correctly himself and he did. When the scholar tried to complicate it more by asking who is my neighbor, Jesus shared the story of the Good Samaritan. Many times in our lives we do the same thing as the scholar. We make things complicated without even realizing it and we search for answers from Jesus that He has really already answered for us but we missed it because we were looking for a complicated answer. As Moses shared with the Israelites in the first reading, "this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious or remote for you." This week would be a great time for us to reflect on the questions, "For what answers am I searching?" And "Has Jesus already answered it and I missed it?"


