### FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

There once was an important football game between two fierce rivals. One team had an obvious advantage in height and weight and they had used well this advantage, having controlled the game for nearly four quarters. Their much smaller opponent had absorbed many vicious blocks and tackles and their bodies had the bruises to prove it. Yet they had one advantage - speed. They were the faster team, particularly Calhoun, the fastest player on the field. As the game neared its

conclusion, Calhoun was his team's only hope.

The coach talked with his quarterback about giving the ball to Calhoun and letting him run with it. The coach was excited as the first play unfolded, but Calhoun did not get the ball. The second play was singled in for Calhoun, but again he did not get the ball. Now the game was in its last minute and the smaller team's only hope was for Calhoun to get the ball and blaze by the bigger, lumbering opponent and score the winning touchdown. Astonishingly, Calhoun did not get the ball. Finally, it ws fourth down, the last chance, and the coach adamantly sent in the play, insisting Calhoun be given the ball. Alas, the ball was snapped, the quarterback was sacked, and the game was lost. The speedy Calhoun never go the ball.

The coach was livid. "I told you," he screamed at the quarterback, "to give Calhoun the ball. Why didn't you?" The quarterback stood his ground. "We tried, Coach," he insisted, "but the problem was Calhoun did not want the ball."

Given a choice, the prophet Amos would have liked to have been like Calhoun. "This isn't my idea!" he might have shouted at the priest Amaziah, "I didn't want to be here."

God is not pleased with the Northern Kingdom of Israel and the wicked king, Jeroboam. This monarch has built a temple in Bethel, thus allowing people to refuse to worship at God's temple in Jerusalem. God decides to send a shepherd and gardener named Amos, rather than a known prophet, to denounce the temple and people of Bethel. This was not a task Amos sought nor a trip north he wanted to take. "This was not my idea!" obedient to God, though, the new prophet speaks boldly to the people with a stinging rebuke of their way of life. One very unhappy with Amos was the priest of Bethel, Amaziah. In today's First Reading, he attempts to chase Amos away, falsely accusing Amos of being a man whose sole purpose was to extort money from the king, a person who would indeed disappear if paid enough. Amos insists he is not a false prophet nor a scheming prophet. He's not a prophet at all. "I was down south watching my sheep and taking care of my sycamores when the Lord called me and sent me up here," he might have said. "This is not my idea!" I'm sure he did say. Unlike Calhoun, however, Amos did what he was told.

The same Lord calls each one of us and the same Jesus Christ sends us forth, just as Jesus did in today's Gospel. Amos was hesitant to make the trip north and I'm sure the Twelve were concerned as they walked away from Jesus, especially since Jesus didn't allow them to take extra provisions. But away they went. That kind of trust is what Jesus expects of us. We may not think we're holy enough or smart enough or well-prepared for our task. But Jesus thinks we're ready.

You see, the Lord is really good at that, picking one person or two and helping the one chosen to complete the task. Amos was sent to Bethel. Six pairs of Apostles were sent around Israel. We're sent around the archdiocese and beyond. And, by gosh, we will go, for our name is Christian, not Calhoun.

May God bless all of you.



\*\*If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.


