Dear Parishioners,

Do you remember your First Holy Communion? I have vague memories of mine. I received our Lord in the Eucharist for the first time in the spring of 1963, right near the end of first grade. Changes from Vatican Council II had not yet been implemented so the Mass was in Latin and the priest, Fr. Richter, the pastor of St. Gregory Church, prayed with his back to us. Though the practice of the time mandated that all receiving Holy Communion kneel at the rail, on First Communion Day we processed twoby-two through the large sanctuary to a kneeler placed near the altar. Reverently we knelt and received the Eucharist on our tongue. I remember being so honored that our Lord came to me, so excited to have Jesus in me. I couldn't wait to get back to my pew and thank Jesus for coming. I consider myself very blessed that the awareness of honor, excitement, and gratitude of that First Communion has never left. Since 1963 I have always been enthusiastic about receiving Holy Communion and now am doubly blessed to not only receive Holy Communion but also consecrate bread and wine to become the Body and Blood of Christ. Since that First Communion Day receiving and distributing the Eucharist is the greatest joy in my life. What is the Eucharist for you?

Do you remember the day you graduated from grade school? Did your school even have a graduation? My graduation in 1970 was from St. Ann School. It was quite simple, just a Mass in the parish church. After Mass three of my friends and our parents went to a restaurant for dinner. Though only 14 years old, we felt so grown-up, so ready for high school and beyond. How'd you feel when you finished elementary school?

I obviously reminisce as we celebrate both First Holy Communion and Graduation this week. Our soon-to-be third grade parishioners, looking beautiful and handsome in their First Communion finery, will approach the altar with great joy this weekend and next. The Lord will nourish them and strengthen them like He never has before. I pray they never lose the joy of receiving Holy Communion.

On Tuesday evening our eighth grade students finally will graduate from Queen of All Saints School. This pandemic caused this class to miss a lot of the normal end-of-the-year traditions and all of us feel bad for them. But this Tuesday will be a special night and via the Mass we will send them to their high schools equipped and supported by prayer.

These eight and fourteen year old youngsters are the mustard seeds and yeast of which Jesus speaks in today's Gospel. They're small, not fully grown, and at the start of their lives. Some of them will still be alive when the next century arrives. Pray for them. Pray that the milestones of life they reach this week will inspire them to grow closer to Christ and be the largest bush or the biggest loaf of bread, to be big on Jesus Christ. Pray, too, that we who have reached a lot of milestones will set a good example for them, especially in our devotion to the gift of Holy Communion.



When you see these roses in church, say a prayer for all the unborn, especially those soon to be parishioners of Oueen of All Saints.




# PLEASE NOTE



St. Bridget of Sweden began receiving visions at the age of seven when she saw an image of a wounded Christ. These visions increased after the death of her husband and they were never in the same style nor did they have the same message. Standing in front of a crucifix inside the Church of St. Paul while on a trip to Rome, she had a vision of Christ. In this divine revelation, Jesus asked her to pray 15 specific prayers per day for a year in honor of the 5840 wounds he received during this Passion. During one of the visions, she asked him who had hurt him. He replied, "Those who despise me and refuse my love for them."


During her lifetime she was well known for her piety and charity towards the poor. She was canonized a saint less than two decades after her death.

### NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

### **PLEASE NOTE**

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
