### FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

I received a letter recently from Archbishop Rozanski and Sandy Koller, President of SSM Health Cardinal Glennon Children's Foundation. It read in part:

"When Cardinal Glennon Hospital opened in 1956, it was with a promise to the community that no child in need of care would ever be turned away. It was thanks in large part to the parishes and families of the Archdiocese that Cardinal Glennon could honor that commitment and continues to do so today.

"Thanks to the support of Queen of All Saints Parish on Glennon Sunday, Cardinal Glennon's healing ministry to make sick children well is stronger than ever. This letter gratefully acknowledges receipt of the parish's collection of \$1,578.

"Many thanks for your continued support to help us evangelize the hospital's Mission: Through our exceptional health care services, we reveal the healing presence of God."

I know as you do that \$1,578 puts barely a dent into the cost of running a hospital, yet our contribution, made with faith in a generous God, can be multiplied many times over and impact thousands of people. Today's Gospel of the multiplication of loaves and fishes proves that.

Catholic publisher Tom McGrath wrote of today's Gospel: "A guy I knew grew up believing his grandmother was with Jesus when he fed the 5,000. He came to that belief because whenever that particular Gospel would be read, everyone in the family whispered, 'Grandma must have been there.' And they would laugh. They all knew that no matter how many people arrived for dinner - even unexpectedly - everyone ate and there was always plenty left over. 'My family was never rich, but they never felt poor, either, my buddy said." McGrath continued: "Some people have a sense of abundance, that there's plenty in life to go around and they love to share what they have. Others are Scrooges who hoard everything, worrying that there can never be enough to satisfy. The apostles were cheap when Jesus asked them to start offering what little they could muster. But then food started showing up, and everyone had plenty. The God who created the countless stars in the sky and who pours out his life into all Creation is no miser. Open your heart; there's plenty for all."

I arrived at QAS two years ago this week and I was immediately impressed at the number of parishioners who definitely are not misers. So many of you have opened your hearts, purses, and wallets to aid not only your fellow parishioners but also those facing struggles throughout the community and archdiocese. I am grateful that your generosity inspires me to open my heart. I don't want to be a miser.

I encourage those of you who find it difficult to offer Jesus your possessions and/or donations to do so quickly. It's the expectation Jesus had of the apostles; it's the expectation he has of us. Jesus is not looking for Scrooges; He's looking for the type of person who, when this Gospel is proclaimed, people smile and whisper, "Grandma must have been there." Don't you want to be like Grandma?

I will be leaving tomorrow morning for vacation in the Ozarks. I'll be back for Mass Sunday morning, but will leave again Sunday night for three more days off, returning in the afternoon of August 4. Know that you will be in my prayers, especially when I offer Mass.

May God bless all of you.

The Queen of All Saints Activities Association is seeking multiple Concession Stand Lead Workers/Supervisors to operate St Louis County's finest sports concession stand.

QAS is seeking a Lead/Supervisor to operate the sports concession stand at the baseball-softball complex. The Lead/Supervisor will be able to coordinate the work schedule between themselves and existing management. Shifts are available Tuesday-Sunday in 4-8 hour increments. Ideally, the applicant will work one to three shifts per week, but this may vary depending on how many are hired.

The concession stand is heated and air conditioned. The stand operates during outdoor sports seasons and shifts are dependent upon the weather; if games are cancelled, then the shift is cancelled.



### DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! - The Word

Many of us have heard the jokes that Catholics don't read the Bible. 

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a \*\*Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

\*\*If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.


