We are called not to hoard but to share. True joy comes from living a grateful and generous lifestyle; becoming more "God-centered" and less "selfcentered."

#### FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners.

An anonymous storyteller once spoke of an old man who lived quietly and contently in a cabin in the woods. He was beloved by the people of the town. His door was always open to anyone in need; he taught generations of children the wonders of the woods and streams and pond.

One day the old man was approached by a group of businessmen. A vein of valuable copper had been discovered on his plot of land. They wanted to buy his property. Money, though, meant nothing to the old man; he just wanted to live in peace in his little cabin. He declined their offer. A fortune was to be made here, they argued, as well as many jobs for the people in the town. The old man, however, would not budge.

When people heard about the copper and the prosperity it would bring their town, they turned on the old man. Their anger grew to a dangerous level and they threatened their former friend, "Unless you are out of this place by sunset, we will drag you out!"

Sunset came, and the old man was still in his cabin. When the mob came to the cabin, they were met by the old man's priest.

"The old man realizes he is going to die before this is over," Father told them, "and he asked me to come out on his behalf and read you his last will and testament."

The crowd fell silent while impatiently waiting for the priest to get on with it. Deliberately, Father began to read from a sheet of paper.

"I leave my fishing rod to you, Pete," Father read from the old man's will. "You caught your first bass with it when you were seven. I leave my rifle to you, Clem. I remember who I taught you to shoot with it. I leave my tin whistle to you, Sarah, grateful for all the beautiful melodies you would play on it."

And the list went on. The old man left his few possessions - his leather boots, his knife, his frying pan, his worn Bible - to the person whom it would mean the most.

One by one, the townsfolk hung their heads in shame and returned to their homes in the silence of the night.

Today's Gospel challenges us to consider just what it is that we consider true wealth. Is it a lot of possessions? A life of ease and comfort? Or is it something more? More special? More inspiring? More sacred?

I'm constantly reminded of my personal wealth every time I go to Ireland. And it's not because I can afford to buy a ticket, stay in a bed-and-breakfast, or buy a round at a pub. No, it's the people. Living on the other side of the Atlantic from most of my relatives makes me appreciate more their hospitality and friendship. It's that "absence makes the heart grow fonder" kind of thing. Being able to see my aunts or my cousins only every three or four years makes me cherish our relationships that much more and allows me to be grateful to have such wonderful people in my life. Truly, they are treasures. So, while there might be other uses for the few thousand dollars I just spent on going over there, like investing the money or, like the guy in the Gospel, putting it in barns so that my life would be more comfortable, I find it better to use my treasures to discover again the treasure that is my family, both those with whom I travel and those we go to see.

On this special weekend celebrating this great parish's Fiftieth Anniversary I appreciate once more the many people who didn't stick their talents, time or resources into a barn, but instead used them to make QAS an extraordinary place, a place where God is praised and God's love is shared in many, many ways. Mary, our Mother and Queen, has been there all along, praying for us constantly. We are grateful to her.

I am grateful to Archbishop Rozanski coming to our parish to celebrate a special Mass for our Anniversary and to our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary committee for their work in making this a special weekend, a treasure whose value cannot be measured.

May God bless all of you.



# A Monthly Rosary for Our Day School & PSR Community



*Why is saying the rosary important?* Catholics use the rosary to pray to God through the intercession of Mary. With the prayers of the rosary, we ask Mary to pray for us and to guide us by the example of her son, Jesus. The prayers of the rosary are simple, meaningful, and they bring us peace.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening</u>, register for a **\*\*Protecting God's Children work**shop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete <u>ALL</u> steps to complete the process.

\*\*If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
