Sometimes we carry what seem to be impossible burdens; we carry our cross. But we might be carrying the wrong cross. Our cross, we are promised, will be easy and our burden light. This might not seem to be true when we suffer the loss of a loved one, a job, our home, or our livelihood. But if we turn to Jesus, we will always find the comfort and loving kindness of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The children look to us adults for comfort and support, for "although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones." We can learn from children about our dependence on God.

So Jesus says to us, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." Again, the Lord's humility reveals neither bragging nor false denial of his power, but an acknowledgement of his love for us.







STAYING AT HOME? GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

THE FRUITS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist in Holy Communion is an intimate union with Christ Jesus. Indeed, the Lord said: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me."

What material food produces in our bodily life, Holy Communion wonderfully achieves in our spiritual life. Communion with the flesh of the risen Christ, a flesh "given life and giving life through the Holy Spirit," preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism. This growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the moment of death, when it will be given to us as viaticum.

Holy Communion separates us from sin. The body of Christ we receive in Holy Communion is "given up for us," and the blood we drink "shed for the many for the forgiveness of sins." For this reason the Eucharist cannot unite us to Christ without at the same time cleansing us from past sins and preserving us from future sins:

For as often as we eat this bread and drink the cup, we proclaim the death of the Lord. If we proclaim the Lord's death, we proclaim the forgiveness of sins. If, as often as his blood is poured out, it is poured for the forgiveness of sins, I should always receive it, so that it may always forgive my sins. Because I always sin, I should always have a remedy.



In the month of July, we come together to venerate the Precious Blood of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus is one of the most ancient Church practices. It is said that the Blessed Virgin venerated the Most Precious Blood of her Infant Son on the day of His circumcision. On that momentous occasion she



united her tears with those of the Word Incarnate, not so much because of the sensible pain, but more so because of His supernatural sorrow for the heardheartedness of mortals.

This was the first of seven instances of the shedding of the Blood of Our Divine Savior. The others are: The Agony in the Garden, The Scourging at the Pillar, The Crowning with Thorns, The Way of the Cross, The Crucifixion and The Piercing of His Heart.



GOD BLESS AMERICA

By IRVING BERLIN

"God Bless America" was written by Russian immigrant Irving Berlin, an early 20th century songwriter who led an incredible rags-to-riches life and died at the age of 101. Originally intended for a Ziegfeld-style revue, Berlin wrote the original version of "God Bless America" in 1918. But feeling the serious nature of the song was not in line with the humorous elements of the production, he abandoned the piece.

Some 20 years later, as war was brewing in Europe, Berlin decided to compose a song of peace. With a few adjustments to echo the times, "God Bless America" was resurrected. On Armistice Day 1938, singer Kate Smith performed the updated version of the song during a radio broadcast. The song was an instant success and went on to become the United States' unofficial national anthem.


