Living a grateful and generous lifestyle reminds us that God will provide all that we need and that we have plenty to share.

FROM OUR PAROCHIAL VICAR



Dear Parishioners,

Over the past two weeks at daily Mass, we have been reading through one of my favorite stories of the Old Testament: the release of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt, and the struggle in the desert immediately following. When God encountered Moses in the burning bush in Exodus 3:7-8, He revealed that He has heard the cries of Israel, and that He will come to save them. The Lord called Moses, who committed the sin of murder just one chapter earlier, to such a lofty mission to free the chosen people from slavery. Sure enough, the Lord worked many mighty deeds and brought about the

plagues to free Israel. As if that wasn't enough, God divided the Red Sea and allowed Israel to escape the Egyptians. Through the miracles He worked, God's saving power was made evidently clear.

The irony in all this is that *even* that was not enough for the people of Israel. As soon as they pass through the Red Sea and were in the desert, the complaining began.... In Exodus 16:3 they said to Moses, "would that we had died at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" How soon we forget all that God has done for us! The Israelites were so weak that they didn't even recognize the holes in their logic. As you "ate your fill of bread"? Do you mean, while you were still slaves? The people of Israel were so concerned with the immediate need in front of their faces, they forgot the great miracles that God had worked to bring them to this point. Not to mention later in Exodus 32: 1-6, when Moses was up on Mount Sinai and the Israelites grew impatient and began worshipping a golden calf. Even though they were technically "free" from slavery in Egypt, the people were still suffering under the bonds of a different type of slavery: idolatry. God always draws His people deeper, and He will not stop until He frees them even from this type of slavery.

I would consider this one of my favorite stories of the Old Testament because I can closely relate to this story. It is easy to read this story and just think, "Those stupid Israelites! Just remember what God did for you and be grateful. It is not that difficult." But, how often do I forget all the great works God has done to bring me to that point? How often do I get so caught up in the concerns right in front of me and forget all the great works God has done! I know it is easy to recall that God is good in general terms, but the Lord invites us to reflect on His goodness in the particulars. How has God freed you from the bonds of sin? How has God gone to great lengths to show you His love? We can see many instances of this in the Scriptures, but what about in your own life? Because, if God really is all-powerful and all-loving, then His Love and His saving work are not just limited to the Scriptures. He greatly desires to manifest His personal Love for you in the events of your life as well. God loves to work in the minor details, that are so easy to miss if we aren't aware. We can also be confident that, although God can work in miraculous and dramatic ways, like He did with Israel in the book of Exodus, He also labors to love you in the ordinary events of your daily life. This week, I would invite you to take some quiet time in prayer and reflect on the particular ways in which God has labored to love you in your life. We recognize that no matter what, He will never abandon us—just like He was loyal to the unfaithful children of Israel. Looking forward to serving all of you!



OUR LADY OF FATIMA

During the First World War (1917), the Blessed Virgin appeared to three shepherd children near Fatima, in Portugal, about 60 miles from Lisbon. Her six visits began in May and ended in October, the month of the Rosary. She requested the daily recitation of

the Rosary, penance, and devotion to her Immaculate Heart.

At Fatima, our Heavenly Mother identified the cause of the difficulties of today's world as its rejection of God - in a single word, sin. She told us that the solution to our problems lay in the conversion of sinners - in our returning to God, and in accepting the mission of praying for the conversion of sinners, helping them to avoid the fate of eternal loss. Unless and until sufficient numbers of people return to God matters will only worsen. Souls will continue to be lost and wars and civil disturbance will continue. Our Heavenly Mother has assured us that in the end her Immaculate Heart will triumph.

SAY "YES" TO OUR LADY

How to Live the Fatima Message:

1. Daily Offering of Sacrifices in Reparation for Sin and Conversion of Sinners

Offer up each day the sacrifices demanded by the duties required of your state in life, as well as whatever hardships and difficulties God permits in your life.

2. The Daily Rosary

The blessed Mother requested the daily Rosary at each of the six apparitions, in reparation for sin, the conversion of sinners, and especially for world peace.

3. Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Consecrate yourself to Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary and wear the brown Scapular as a sign of your consecration.

4. Practice the First Saturday Communion of Reparation

On December 10, 1925, Our Lady requested this devotion to Sister Lucia while she was at the Dorothean Convent, on five consecutive months with the intention of making reparation for the blasphemies against her Immaculate Heart. The essential elements of the practice of the First Saturday Devotion are:

- Go to Confession (May be 8 days before or after)
- Receive Holy Communion
- Pray five decades of the Rosary
- Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary
- The above exercises should be performed on the first Saturday of five consecutive months with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.




