We don't want to cause any turmoil, However, many times this is at the expense of the truth! The truth being Jesus Christ. Too many people are misguided because they rely on their own limited human ability to reason and are not allowing faith in God to guide them. Form your conscience; take a stance for life, marriage and religious liberty.

## **FROM OUR PASTOR**



Dear Parishioners.

I don't know any professional athletes. None of my friends belong to teams in the Major Leagues, or the NFL, NBA, PGA, or NHL, or any other alphabet-laced professional league. That being so, I've never been able to ask any of them what it was like to play in an empty stadium or vacant golf courses. It had to be strange, weird, and definitely unusual during the pandemic.

Some places tried to compensate for the lack of fans by pumping in crowd noise. How pathetic, how silly, thought I. Really, how excited or charged up can you be when, after getting a base hit or making a basket, someone flips a switch and a recorded crowd starts cheering? Did that help a competitor at all? Did anyone ever say, "Oh, boy, there's artificial cheering coming through the public address system. Now, I'm gong to try harder to win the game!" I'd love to ask a pro if the fake noise helped at all, if it inspired anyone. I'll bet it didn't.

Crowds are an important part of athletic competition and many teams win more games at home than they do on the road. The home crowd advantage is real. A determination to do better, achieve more, win, touches the heart of many an athlete. This crowd is cheering for me, an athlete reasons, and I want to show my appreciation by doing well. I'm sure all of us would do the best we can if 50,000 or 60,000 people in a stadium were encouraging us and clapping for us.

But what if it wasn't a stadium? What if it were a cloud? And what if it wasn't applause from paying customers? What if the cheers were coming from saints? Today's Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews uses an athletic comparison to inspire us to do our best for the Lord: "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus...."

In this case, the competition is a track meet. The finish line is eternal life with Christ. The crowds are the saints who enjoy already this heavenly dwelling. Achieving Paradise, though, does not mean one ignores those on Earth. No, saints gather to cheer us on. Like athletes who take off sweatsuits and jackets before the race starts, we remove sin from our lives by going to Confession. Knowing that if you run with your head down you'll get lost or hurt, we run with head high, our eyes fixed on Jesus. He endured the cross for our sake; we compete for him. Thankfully, we don't compete in an empty arena with fake noise. We compete in the Church, surrounded by a cloud of witnesses cheering for us by a cloud of witnesses cheering for us.

Of course, support from the folks still on Earth is very helpful, too, even if sometimes it is slow to come. A wonderful story is told about the great scientist Booker T. Washington, head of the Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. One day Booker was walking past the house of a wealthy family. The woman of the house, seeing a black man, assumed Washington was one of the yard workers her husband had hired and told him to chop some wood for her. Professor Washington obliged, taking off his coat and grabbing an ax. After chopping the wood he carried an armload through the back door and into the kitchen. One of the maids recognized him and rushed to tell the woman just who had chopped the wood.

The next day, the woman appeared in Washington's office. Apologizing profusely, she said repeatedly, "I did not know it was you I put to work." Washington replied, "It's entirely all right, madam. I like to work, and I'm delighted to do favors for my friends."

The woman was so taken with Washington's humility and kindness that she gave generous gifts to the institute and persuaded many of her wealthy friends to do likewise. In the end, Washington raised as much money for the institute from this one act of chopping wood as he did from any other fundraiser. Eyes fixed on Jesus, competing well, will always bring support in heaven and on earth.
