We are called to be good stewards by using those gifts to do the work that He has planned for each of us. If we deny our gifts or fail to use them as God calls us to use them, then some part of His work will be left undone.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

I once had a job with the Missouri Drivers License Bureau that put me in contact with people whose drivers license had been suspended or revoked. Frequently the people who came into our S. Kingshighway office, or who called on the phone, were very upset or confused or angry - or all three - because the time of their suspension or revocation had passed and still the State had not returned their drivers license or license plates. "What's the deal?" they demanded.

In almost all situations, they had failed to read the small print on their suspension or revocation notice. There they would have read that before a license could be returned, thus allowing them to legally operate a vehicle, they had to purchase a certain, expensive type of insurance. Unless they could prove they had done so, they could not drive legally, and it didn't matter if the suspension time had ended. You can imagine the outbursts -"This isn't fair!" "I can't afford that!" "How am I supposed to get to work or drive my kids around?" My ears burned as their words came blasting through the phone and I felt bad for their predicament, but there was nothing I could do to help them.

St. Paul in today's Second Reading assures the Romans they will never feel that way. For the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable," the Apostles write. St. Paul is writing to the Gentiles of Rome, people who will embrace the message of Christ, and people who may be thinking that Jews who do not believe in Christ are doomed, that God has revoked his covenant with them. Not so, says Paul. God is not in the business of revoking any of his gifts, especially mercy, nor will God make it expensive and costly to draw near to him. A plea for forgiveness, a willingness to be loved deeply, a commitment to follow Christ, that's all it takes. No need for anger, no cause for confusion, no uncertainty about what to do next. That's how good our God is, that's how wonderful it is when the gifts of God are irrevocable.

The poet William Butler Yeats wrote, "Education is not the filling of a pail, but the lighting of a fire." Well, at long last, and after a five month absence, we are going to start lighting some fires this week. Some Queen of All Saints School students return Wednesday, some Thursday. For the next few weeks we are using a hybrid plan for education, half the school Monday-Wednesday and every other Friday, half on Tuesday and Thursday. Our hope is to allow faculty and students to have this time to adjust to all the new rules and practices. Then, if all goes well, the entire school will begin a full week of classes following Labor Day. I am thankful for the many, many hours of work put forth by our principal, Mrs. Millburg, our faculty, and our maintenance staff. Everything possible has been done to assure the safety of all during the time of Covid-19.

Even though school will be unlike anything us old folks had, the lighting of a fire will still occur. Lessons will be taught, assignments complete, and prayers offered. As it should be, Jesus Christ will be at the center of all that happens in the 2020-21 school year. You are a part of that fire. Your prayers and financial support are essential to all that happens in the school building. May God bless your effort in this important and sacred work.

As you know, we had a terrible storm last Monday evening. I am so thankful to all who were here Tuesday morning to clean the grounds and make repairs, both inside and outside of the rectory. Your willingness to serve others is an inspiration to me.

Finally, Kenrick-Glennon Seminary has asked our parish to accept a seminary student who will serve a nine month internship here. We were happy to do so and thus we welcome Jacob Braun to Queen of All Saints. Jacob will be living in the rectory and ministering to you in a variety of ways. Please welcome him and ask God to guide him during this internship year.




ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS

GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
