We need to believe that Jesus has a better plan in store for us.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A minister once told the story of a successful businessman who was asked the secret of his success. He asked for a piece of paper and wrote on it three words: AND THEN SOME. The man said he had learned early in life that the difference between average people and truly successful people could be stated simply in those three words. Top people did what was expected, and then some.

It is encouraged, therefore, to let "and then some" serve as an inspiration in life. Practice faith faithfully - and then some. Give generously of your time and resources - and then some. Greet those you meet with a smile - and then some. Meet your obligations; be dependable - and then some. Do your best in all things and at all times - and then some.

Jesus set the standard of "and then some" in today's Gospel. He and the apostles are in a deserted place and are surrounded by a vast crowd. Knowing that in such a deserted place they would not be able to find food, Jesus tells the disciples to feed this crowd, knowing the disciples would be unable to do so. Jesus also knew, and always trusted, that the heavenly Father would provide, and then some. Raising his eyes and pronouncing the blessing, Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes and fed everybody in the crowd, with twelve wicker baskets full of leftovers, in other words - and then some.

Such generosity was not uncommon for Christ. Miracles like this, and others involving the restoration of sight, hearing, or the ability to walk always went beyond mere satisfaction from hunger or the ability to use the body's senses or faculties. They also included the invitation to grow deeper in faith and to bring that faith to their families and villages. Success for Christ was not measured by a one time marvel. Success was found in the vigor of faith and the expansion of the Kingdom of God.

Our success is discovered in the same way, by cherishing Christ's presence and power in our lives and proclaiming that presence by what we say and do. We pray that the same generosity Christ revealed to that vast crowd may now be revealed by each one of us, disciples who strive daily to bring Christ to others - and then some.

I want to thank our Coordinator of Religious Education, Ann Bender, for all the work she and her helpers did to make our recent First Communion Masses so special and beautiful. Your work is much appreciated. Please keep praying for our First Communicants and their families. May their primary source of nourishment always be the Body of Christ.

Dear Friends in Christ.

Since 1956, the Archdiocese of St. Louis has sent over 45 archdiocesan priests to serve the people of Bolivia, one of the poorest countries in South America. This year, we offer praise and thanks to our Lord, as Fr. Patrick Hayden and Fr. James Michler continue to serve in the Latin America Apostolate, each with over 25 years of missionary service to the apostolate. Their perseverance and endurance, especially in the midst of the recent crisis in Bolivia, is an outstanding testimony to their faith and to the support and encouragement they receive through the faithful of our local archdiocese.

All of us are facing unprecedented challenges because of the pandemic. Pope Francis reminds us, "Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realized that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other. On this boat... are all of us. Just like those disciples, who spoke anxiously with one voice, saying 'We are perishing' (v. 38), so we too have realized that we cannot go on thinking of ourselves, but only together can we do this" (Meditation in Saint Peter's Square, 27 March 2020). Right now, we have the opportunity to come together. We are the Body of Christ and are called to live this reality; comforting one another. One of the ways we can do this is through the support of our Latin America Apostolate. Our brothers and sisters in Bolivia are, too, suffering the effects of the pandemic. Without the prayers and sacrifices of the people of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, our Latin America Apostolate could not offer pastoral care, formation, catechesis, and social services to the parish community of Maria Reina. Ask God how He is calling you to participate in this mission financially. Please pray for our Latin America Apostolate, missionaries, and all involved with this ministry. The annual collection for our Latin America Apostolate will take place in all parishes during the weekend of August 1st & 2nd. I am asking God's blessings on you and your families, and am grateful for your support of our Latin America Apostolate.






SALAD DONATIONS NEEDED FOR St. Patrick Center

SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY



Saint John Mary Vianney is familiarly known as the Cure of Ars and as such is the heavenly patron of all parish priests.

He was born of poor parents in Dardilly, France, in 1786. He began his studies for the priesthood at the age of nineteen and only after

many failures and difficulties was he ordained in 1815.

He was appointed pastor of the village of Ars where the Faith had practically vanished. Here he labored for the rest of his life gaining a worldwide reputation as a priest who practiced great penance, exercised a wondrous power in the confessional, and softened the hearts of sinners by his preaching.

After many trials, not the least of which was an obsession by the devil, Father Vianney, exhausted by his labors and his penance, returned his soul to God in 1859 He was canonized in 1929 and his feast is celebrated on August 4.

Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - No Gift is Too Small

The feeding of the five thousand is a reminder of two important ideas in being good stewards of the gifts that God has given us. First, when problems arise, God calls on us to be part of the solution. We should absolutely ask the Holy Spirit for guidance, but we must also be willing to act, even if that means being put in an uncomfortable position or doing something that others may not understand at first. Second, no gift is too small or insignificant in God's plan. Too many times we use the excuse of "I don't know how to do that," "I don't have enough time," or I don't have enough money" when invited to participate in the mission and ministry of the Church. Know that God is calling each of us in the present moment and in our current circumstances into a loving relationship with Him. Your generosity at that specific moment may be the answer to someone else's prayer.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
