If we say we serve God, we must actually do something and not merely talk about it!

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

On the day before bass season opened, Jimmy and his father were fishing early in the evening on a New England lake. After using worms to catch perch and sunfish, Jimmy decided to practice casting with a small silver lure. No sooner had his lure hit the water than his pole doubled over. Jimmy knew right away that he had something huge on the line. By the time he reeled in the fish, a giant moon had risen over the lake. In the moonlight, Jimmy saw the

biggest fish he had ever seen...but it was a bass.

Jimmy's dad struck a match to look at his watch:

10 p.m., two hours before bass season opened. "You'll have to put it back, son," the father said. Jimmy protested. "There'll never be another fish as big as this one!" He even looked to see if there were other fishermen or boats. No one around. No one would know. Still, Jimmy knew by the tone of his father's voice that there would be no discussion. He carefully worked the hook from the lip of the bass and lowered it into the water.

Jimmy was right. He takes his own children to that lake now and in the past thirty-four years, he has never seen a bass that big. But he readily admits that any time he faces a question of ethics, he sees that fish again and has to smile. A decision to do right always lives fresh and sweet in the memory.

"As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Thus states Joshua in today's First Reading. At long last, God's Chosen People have entered the Promised Land. Those already living there did not easily turn over their property to the former slaves from Egypt. God, using Joshua as a military leader, took the side of His Chosen and secured for them this land flowing with milk and honey. That was the easy part. More difficult was keeping God's Chosen faithful to God. Many found it easier to adapt to the Gods, albeit non-existing gods, than to remain obedient to the Covenant God had made with his people. Worship of the gods of the Amorites seemed so attractive, even if it had no foundation.

Joshua will not have it. He reminds the people in today's reading that the one true God brought them up from slavery, took their side against Pharoah, performed great miracles before their very eyes, and protected them along the journey. I am sure the family of Joshua saw in him the same determined look Jimmy saw in the face of his father. No sense in arguing. "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

This week, on Wednesday, the 25th, we celebrate the feast of the patron of our archdiocese and metropolitan area, St. Louis. Here we find another father determined to do what's right, especially in matters of religion. Like Jimmy's dad and Joshua, I'm sure the family of St. Louis could tell by his face that the royal household would serve France after they had served God. In a spiritual testament given by the king to his son, Louis wrote: "My dearest son, my first instruction is that you should love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your strength. Without this there is no salvation. Keep yourself, my son, from everything that you know displeases God, that is to say, from every mortal sin...." "In conclusion, dearest son, I give you every blessing that a loving father can give a son. May the three Persons of the Holy Trinity and all the saints protect you from every evil. And may the Lord give you the grace to do his will so that God may be served and honored through you."

As mentioned above, Jimmy knew by the tone of his father's voice there would be no discussion. Joshua and St. Louis must have had the same tone. May we, also, in our voice, sure, but in our actions, service, love, and prayers, too. No doubt, no discussion, for a decision to do right always lives fresh and sweet in the memory. "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."



FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT SOUL EXPANDING QUALITIES

In Matthew 7:15-20, Jesus tells us that a tree is known by its fruits. In the fifth chapter of his Letter to the Galatians, Paul makes this very specific. He tells us that the fruits of the Holy Spirit are "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, (and) self-control," implying that the Spirit's presence in one's life can be read from its radiance in these soul-expanding qualities. All of Paul's fruits of the Holy Spirit are marks of an outward-looking, expansive *magna anima* (the cramped soul) of the sinner. Thus love is willing the good of the other as other; joy is self-diffusive; patience bears with the troublesome; kindness makes the other gentle; self-control restricts the havoc that the ego can cause; etc.

When is the Sprit present? When these attributes are awakened and sustained; when our souls are made great.

In the last chapter of the Book of Joshua we read, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." How many of us wish that we could go back in time and be better spiritual leaders for our families when our children were younger. Too many of us think that it is too late to start. 



At times, as a mother or father, you might feel ill-equipped to teach and guide the children entrusted to your care, and yet you are worthy. In fact, you are called to instruct, lead, and encourage your family members to become saints. If you struggle in faith and confidence in this role, take heart, because you are not alone!


In early August, the Church celebrates the patron saint of parish priests, St. John Vianney. This pious saint wanted nothing more than to be a priestly father, but he struggled so badly academically that he was released from the major seminary in Lyons, as he was considered too slow. When St. John Vianney was finally ordained, he was sent to the tiny parish of Ars, France where it was thought he could do little harm. However, as a parish father in Ars, feeling a sense of frustration and possible inadequacy, Fr. Vianney attempted to leave his parish family for the monastic life on several occasions, though never getting too far. Finally, resigning his fate and faith to the Lord and seeking the protection of the Blessed Mother, Fr. Vianney, from the tiny town of Ars, became internationally known for his insight, wisdom, humility, and clarity in both confession and in his preaching.

As a baptized Christian, you are anointed as a priest, prophet, and king (CCC 1268). As a leader of your family, know that you are qualified and obligated to bring the domestic church alive in your home. When you feel less than qualified or simply ineffective, turn to God for strength – to the Almighty Father who gives us life, to His Son who gives us the Gospel and an example of unconditional love, and to the Spirit whose gifts flood our souls with wisdom, understanding, good counsel, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

The key is to take time with your family. Share the gifts of the Spirit by your words and example. Lead your family in the domestic liturgy of your home through daily family prayer. Talk to God, praise Him, thank Him, and petition Him. Be a true prophet to your family and teach them the genuine will of God. Help your children know their value as prince and princesses in this most holy royal family (1 Peter 2:9).

With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding.
