FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Some years ago I saw a movie about the French queen Marie Antoinette, wife of King Louis XVI. One scene in the movie shows the couple, still newlyweds, having a meal in the dining room of the Palace of Versailles. The room is huge and the food is piled high on the table, all sorts of meats, vegetables and delicacies. The royal couple, though, would never reach for any of these items. A flurry of servants was present and all it took was a glance from the king or queen to set them into motion, hastening to put food on a plate or wine into a glass. The monarchs must never wait long for anything.

From reading history, especially about the doomed Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette, I would guess that the portrayal of this meal is accurate. If so, it would be remarkably different from the meals of another King Louis who lived in a much smaller palace 500 years earlier. The dinner table in that palace would have had a large crowd around it, many of them the king's children and few of them servants. Where servants would later be in the 18th century, poor people would be in the 13th century. King Louis IX made sure of that.

The official date of St. Louis' Feast is Tuesday, August 25. But, in one of his last acts as our spiritual leader, Archbishop Carlson has given permission to transfer the Feast to today. Thus, do we thank God this day for St. Louis and honor his holy life.

Our St. Louis has taken a beating lately. People shout that he was brutal toward Muslims and antagonistic toward Jews. Some scream that his statue in Forest Park should be removed and a few have suggested that the City and County should be renamed. Such thoughts are nonsense.

St. Louis was a man of faith and a dedicated servant of God. He was an adoring husband and a caring father to eleven children. He started universities and built hospitals, reformed the court system, and united his country. His dealings with the Jews were better than any other king in 13th century Europe and the Crusades he led were not to murder innocent Muslims but to retake lands that Muslims had stolen. And every day, at that dining room table, Louis invited poor people to eat with him, but not seeking to be uplifted as a royal but to imitate Christ as a servant. We do well to imitate the faith and qualities of this man!

The actual day of the Feast of St. Louis - the 25th - is a special day for our Archdiocese. We see an end to the service of Archbishop Carlson, and we thank him for his work. And we welcome Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski, asking God to bless and guide this new archbishop as he shepherds his new flock. Archbishop Rozanski comes to us in a time of uncertainty. The pandemic, social unrest, political polemics, and concerns about our Catholic faith will all demand his attention. We will look to him to answer questions about the number of parishes we need, the future of Catholic schools, vocations to the priesthood, and what we can and must do to help the poor. Archbishop Rozanski will be busy, starting August 26th, and he will need our prayers that day and every day he serves as our archbishop. Let us not fail to ask God to guide him.

WELCOME TO QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS

JACOB (JAKE) BRAUN



To the parishioners of Queen of All Saints:

As many of you know, from my introduction at last Sunday's Masses, I am a seminarian for the Archdiocese of St. Louis, from Union, Missouri. I will be living full-time at Queen of All Saints as a pastoral intern. This is my fifth year of seminary formation, and I am excited to be able to immerse myself in the life of this parish, beyond Sunday

Masses. To begin my weekly bulletin posts, I want to tell you a bit about my background and what brought me to seminary.

Even from a very young age — maybe 4 or 5 years old — I told my family that I wanted to be a priest. Coming from a strong, Catholic, homeschooling family, this desire for the priesthood was cultivated by daily Mass attendance and religion classes that helped me to grow in love for the Faith. But, by the time I reached high school, my desire for the priesthood lacked the requisite depth and maturity that could weather the ordinary storms of life. While I never doubted that God was calling me to the priesthood, questions about the inherent sacrifice of priestly celibacy, and whether I would be happy as a priest, convinced me as a teen that I should pursue a more ordinary path. I never wanted to stop being Catholic, but I also knew that being too close to God would make it impossible to ignore His voice, which I believed was calling me to the priesthood. So, over the course of the next several years, I ran headlong from the very idea of the priesthood, living the life of a thoroughly lukewarm Catholic college student at Missouri S&T. In retrospect, I see how little I trusted God.

After a few years of college, feeling the discontent of a way of life that led me away from God, I began to frequent the sacraments, hoping and trusting that Christ would lead me to a place of fulfillment. Almost as soon as I re-engaged in my Catholic faith, and after many hours of prayer, I knew that I needed to consider a call to the priesthood in an honest, discerning manner. I learned in that time before seminary, and continue to learn, how to surrender my fears and concerns to the God who is more concerned for my well-being and happiness than even I am for myself. The joy that I have experienced by trusting God to lead me where I ought to go has affirmed the discernment that I have done to this point. I am ecstatic to see the impact that this parish, and the people in it, will have on my continued discernment this year.

DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! THE PAPACY

Many Protestants overlook the importance of Matthew 16:18 and do not understand that it is the most prominent passage in which Christ establishes a hierarchy within the Church with Peter as its first leader. Memorize Matthew 16:18. It is a verse that all Catholics should know and be able to respond with when someone says that the Bible doesn't mention anything about having a pope. Because of his confession of Christ as the son of the living God, Christ chose Peter to be the rock upon which He would build His church. Here we are 20 centuries later, and the gates of hell have not prevailed against it. Christ chose an ordinary, flawed, unqualified individual to lead the Church. Peter would be the first among many popes.

Who is the pope? The pope is the bishop of Rome, the shepherd of the entire flock of believers, who is also "the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful. For the Roman Pontiff, by reason of his office as Vicar of Christ, and as pastor of the entire Church has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered" (CCC 882). Let us pray for our pope daily so that he may receive strength, guidance, and wisdom. Vival Papa!

GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
