STEWARDSHIP

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you."

LUKE 14:13-14

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Last Thursday, August 25th, we in the Archdiocese celebrated the Feast of our Patron Saint, St. Louis. Though millions live in this metropolitan area which bears his name, many don't have any idea who he was. Louis was born in 1214 and became King of France when he was just 22 years old. He and his wife, Marguerite, had eleven children.

St. Louis was devoted to the people of France. He reformed the court system, demanding that even the poorest of the poor be given a fair trial. He enriched the faith of the people by building cathedrals, churches, and monasteries. He enhanced their knowledge by building universities, schools, and libraries. He aided in their health by building hospitals and he was mindful of the disadvantaged, building orphanages and feeding the poor, frequently inviting the poor to eat with him in his castle.

Louis was asked by the Pope to lead one of the Crusades, and while doing so he died from disease in Northern Africa in 1270.

In a spiritual testament he left to his eldest son, Louis wrote: "If the Lord has permitted you to have some trial, bear it willingly and with gratitude, considering that it has happened for your good and that perhaps you well deserved it. If the Lord bestows upon you any kind of prosperity, thank him humbly and see that you become no worse for it, either through vain pride or anything else, because you ought not to oppose God or offend God in the matter of his gifts."

"Listen to the Divine Office (a set of prayers said throughout each day by priests, religious sisters and brothers, and many lay people) with pleasure and devotion. As long as you are in church, be careful not to let your eyes wander and not to speak empty words, but pray to the Lord devoutly, either aloud or with the interior prayer of the heart."

"Be kindhearted to the poor, the unfortunate and the afflicted. Give them as much help and consolation as you can. Thank God for all the benefits he has bestowed upon you, that you may be worthy to receive greater. Be just to your subjects, swaying neither right or left, but holding the line of justice. Always side with the poor rather than with the rich, until you are certain of the truth. See that all your subjects live in justice and peace."

Certainly as Queen of All Saints Parish finishes its final formal celebration of our 50th Anniversary we can see in our history a manifestation of the qualities St. Louis encouraged his son to possess. Qualities like attentiveness to prayer, mindfulness of the poor, and gratitude to God for the many blessings God has bestowed upon us. We pray to continue to receive these gifts in a humble manner, never having, as St. Louis says, "a vain pride or anything else," but always trying to "be worthy to receive greater."

Humility is at the core of today's scripture readings. Sirach says, "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God." Jesus says, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

A writer named Marie Culing put it this way:

If ever I'm disappointed with my lot in life, I stop and think about Little Jimmy from down the street. He was trying for a part in his school play. His mother told me he'd set his heart on being in it, though she feared he wouldn't be chosen. On the day the parts were awarded, I went with her to collect Jimmy after school. He rushed up, eyes shining with pride and excitement. Then he said those words that remain a lesson to me, "I've been chosen to clap and cheer!"

Humility. Christ had it. Christ expects it. We must practice it now, as so many have in the past fifty years.

Perhaps you're wondering what happened on August 19th when all of the priests had their big meeting with Archbishop Rozanski about the future of parishes in the Archdiocese. Nothing. Those making plans in the All Things New program presented many different ideas about what to do with all of our parishes. Over fifty different scenarios were proposed and briefly discussed. The priests may now submit their suggestions and in the next few months more people will be invited to hear the same proposals - or new ones - and offer their suggestions. All Things New is a long process and we're barely halfway through it. Please be patient and prayerful.

Based on the survey results of the Discipleship Maker Index (DMI) that was offered in the spring of this year, seeing an increase in young adult involvement is the top priority of the archdiocese. In response, the "All Things New" Team, the Office of Young Adult Ministry and the Young Adult Ministry Subcommittee have created a survey to gather feedback from young adults.

All young adults whether single, discerning, married, priest or religious, with or without children, ages 18-39 are encouraged to fill out the survey.

Young adults may anonymously share their beliefs and interests, their needs, their experience in parishes, and their hopes for the future of the Church of St. Louis.

The survey will **close September 12th** with a report being published in October.

You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
