We often forget this stewardship wisdom when we spend all of our time, talent and treasure to gain more of the world's riches. We need to set our priorities based on God's values and not the values of the material world.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

"In whatever arena of life one may meet the challenge of courage, whatever may be the sacrifices he faces if he follows his conscience - the loss of friends, his fortune, his contentment, even the esteem of his fellow men - each person must decide the course he will follow. The stories of past courage can define that ingredient - they can teach, they can offer hope, they can provide inspiration. But they cannot supply courage itself. For this each man must look into his own soul."

The above words from President John Kennedy ring true as Jesus reaches the point described by St. Matthew in today's Gospel. The passage begins by informing us that Jesus tells his disciples that he is turning toward Jerusalem. He will go there and he will suffer greatly. The elders, chief priests, and the scribes will dog Jesus relentlessly. Additionally, these culprits will stir up the crowd, whipping them into a frenzy that will conclude with the crowd screaming, "Crucify him." How else but with courage does Jesus take the first step toward Jerusalem?

Here, as our 35th President noted, is the one who meets the challenge, here the man decides the course he must follow. Jesus knew about the bravery of the prophets, the dedication of Moses, and the defiant example of John the Baptist. Jesus was blessed with models of inspiration. But now Jesus must look into his own soul, find his own courage, start on the path of salvation. He looks into his soul and there discovers a mountain of courage.

We know people like Jesus. I'm not the only one who has witnessed the manifestation of courage. I have found my own inspiration in the faith of the cancer patient entering hospice, aware that earthly life is ending but confidently trusting that Jesus will bring them over the abyss of death. I've seen the courage of the people who stand outside the abortion clinic upholding the value of every human life. They stand with dignity while too many people pass by yelling insults or holding up one finger to degrade them. I read articles about the missionaries of our Church - priests, religious sisters and brothers, lay men and women - who strive to defend the rights of the poor people they serve. Too often these missionaries are put to death for doing so. What courage!

Last week I was privileged to be with another group of people I consider courageous, our Youth Group. I gave a talk last Sunday to over 35 teens and college students whom I'm sure are taunted or teased by their peers. I can remember how people of faith were treat4ed when I was a teenager. I imagine it's worse now. Back in the 70's no one ever heard of the "none's" and no one ever considered people of faith, people who held themselves to a Christian moral standard, to be classified as intolerant bigots. They do those things now and I'll bet our teenagers have felt the wrath of our society. Yet, there they were last Sunday, and the Sunday before that, and tonight. They're having fun, they're playing games, they're talking about their Catholic faith, and they're praying. I admire them and I find hope in their courage. May God watch over them and strengthen them as they follow Jesus Christ.

Today, may each one of us renew our own commitment, meet the challenges, and decide the course, to look into our soul and find courage.

FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN

As someone who was always been charmed by the sciences, I have been struck by the size and beauty of the universe we live in. Thanks to

the internet and astronomical tools like the Hubble space telescope, it is now possible for anyone with a computer to see photos of the distant galaxies and nebulas that contribute to the grandeur of this created universe. But in addition to showing the splendor and scale of our universe, these tools have made modern man acutely aware of his own smallness. Next to stars hundreds of times more massive than the sun or galaxies made up of trillions of such stars, our presence on earth can seem so insignificant, our lives and actions bereft of meaning. This sort of modern and post-modern angst is what undergirds the thinking of many existentialist philosophers like Nietzsche, Sartre, and Kierkegaard, who grapple impressively, though imperfectly, with man's search for meaning.

And so, the question lingers: Does our existence matter?

In a book entitled Old Errors and New Labels, Ven. Fulton Sheen addresses this problem of "cosmic intimidation," by which man struggles to see his own inherent value in the context of so vast a cosmos. Part of the problem, Sheen posits, is that our way of thinking is flawed. Because our modern minds tend to view all things in relation to man, the revelations of science can make us seem small and unimportant. But the Christian way of thinking pierces the veil of matter, assuring us that our value is not measured so much in quantity as it is in quality, and that the universe around us serves not as a monument to our finitude but to the greatness of God. Why, when we look into the sky and feel small, should we not instead wonder at the Being who created the earth and put the stars in motion? Why, when we discover new laws of physics, do we not ask ourselves what those laws tell us about the existence of a Lawgiver? The most important referent when considering the awesome size and beauty of the universe should be the God who created it, not man who simply partakes of that beauty. In comparison with God, even the rapidly expanding universe in which we live is as nothing, and the psychological burden of its size is naught when we consider our special place in creation as rational beings.

"Magnify and extol the heavens as much as one pleases," Fulton Sheen says. "Multiply interstellar distances unto a mathematical infinity; the fact still remains that man understands the heavens and can interpret their movements in rational language." In all of physical creation, it is human beings who can understand and write down in words what God has written with creation itself. At the pinnacle of biology stands humans, created in the image and likeness of a God who never needed to create us, let alone redeem us, but chose to do so in perfect gratuity. In the physical sense, we are a speck in the cosmos. But as rational beings, as beings capable of free action, as beings with immortal souls, we straddle the line between what is physical and what is spiritual. We live on the border between time and eternity, as caretakers and stewards of all that is below us in the order of creation. Though the bodies we have in this world will pass away, and this universe itself will one day fade out of existence, we who have immortal souls will not. On the last day, God willing, we too will partake of Christ's glorious Resurrection, to live with Him for all eternity.

I invite you to pray with this, using Psalm 8:2-10 (also, n.b. 1 Corinthians 15:35-58):

- 2 O Lord, our Lord,
 - how awesome is your name through all the earth! I will sing of your majesty above the heavens
- 3 with the mouths of babes and infants. You have established a bulwark against your foes, to silence enemy and avenger.
- 4 When I see your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and stars that you set in place—
- 5 What is man that you are mindful of him, and a son of man that you care for him?
- 6 Yet you have made him little less than a god, crowned him with glory and honor.
- 7 You have given him rule over the works of your hands, put all things at his feet:
- 8 All sheep and oxen, even the beasts of the field,
- 9 The birds of the air, the fish of the sea, and whatever swims the paths of the seas.
- 10 O Lord, our Lord, how awesome is your name through all the earth!

THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
