

On the greatest feasts and solemnities of the Church's liturgical year, the three readings are chosen to all apply to the theme or the event being celebrated. During Ordinary Time, however, only the Jewish scriptures/Old Testament selections are chosen to go with the Gospel. The second reading makes its way independently through the New Testament letters and often appears to have a very different message.

Today's readings, however, present us with that happy coincidence of a Sunday in Ordinary Time in which all three readings are very much closely connected—a connection that we might describe as God's generosity in nurturing the people so that they can in turn "nourish" each other by their acts of service and charity.

SERVE EACH OTHER

In John's Gospel, Jesus insists over and over that he is the bread of life; when he sees that some of his listeners find this hard to believe, he insists on it even more strongly. Note that



centuries before the Christians celebrate Jesus as the Bread of Life in the Eucharist, the psalmist sings, "Taste and see how good the Lord is!"

John's Gospel contains no blessing of the Bread and Cup that the Church uses to consecrate the bread and wine. What John does have is Jesus washing the feet of the disciples and commanding them to wash each other's feet, which is to say, to serve each other without regard to station or rank. He also gives a long, prayerful discourse in which he gives the "new commandment" to love one another. Receiving Holy Communion is much more than a "me and Jesus" moment, although that is undoubtedly a precious encounter. Ultimately, our reception of the Bread of Life attains its fullness only in our mutual love and service in our communities and beyond.

God fed Elisha to strengthen him on his journey. God fed the Israelites with manna on their journey in the wilderness. Today, we receive from God the Bread of Life for strength in whatever journey we are on.

DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! - The Bread of Life Continued

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." This statement caused some of Jesus' disciples to turn and run away; while for others, this statement galvanized their belief in God that they ultimately gave their life for Jesus. Where do you stand? Do you truly believe that the bread and wine we receive at Mass is the actual flesh and blood of Christ? If so, why? How would you explain the Eucharist to a curious friend? If not, why not? Many people believe in God. But there is a big difference between knowing facts about God and actually having a relationship with Him. You have to spend time with someone to develop a relationship, not read a book about them. God wants a personal relationship with each one of us. Take time every day, in silence, talking and listening to the Lord. Invite Him into your heart and enjoy the fruits of your new friendship.

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)

Edith Stein, born in 1891 in Breslau, Poland, was the youngest child of a large Jewish family. She was an outstanding student and was well versed in philosophy with a

particular interest in phenomenology. Eventually she became interested in the Catholic Faith, and in 1922, she was baptized at the Cathedral Church in Cologne, Germany. Eleven years later Edith entered the Cologne Carmel. Because of the ramifications of politics in Germany, Edith, whose name in religion was Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, was sent to the Carmel at Echt, Holland. When the Nazis conquered Holland, Teresa was arrested, and, with her sister Rose, was sent to the concentration camp at Auschwitz. Teresa died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz in 1942 at the age of fifty-one. In 1987, she was beatified in the large outdoor soccer stadium in Cologne by Pope John Paul II. Out of the unspeakable human suffering caused by the Nazis in western Europe in the 1930's and 1940's, there blossomed the beautiful life of dedication, consecration, prayer, fasting, and penance of Saint Teresa. Even though her life was snuffed out by the satanic evil of genocide, her memory stands as a light undimmed in the midst of evil, darkness, and suffering. She was canonized on October 11, 1998.



EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

"Be still and know that I am God." Ps 46

Even a few short moments of this silent presence to the Lord is a precious treasure, for it is in this silence that the Lord speaks to us.

As we sit in silence before the Lord, we are irradiated by His Eucharistic presence. We all need "radiation therapy" - and to receive it, we only need to be *present*, just as in sunbathing we only need to be present to the ultra-violet radiation of the sun.

How beautifully St. Maria Faustina describes her long, silent "talks" with the Lord:

Silence is so powerful a language that it reaches the throne of the living God. Silence is His language, though secret, yet living and powerful (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalski, 888).

In silence I tell You everything, Lord, because the language of love is without words (Diary, 1489).

Like St. Faustina, we all need to spend times of silence in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord to let Him minister to us with His healing, merciful love.

And we also need these times of silent presence to love Him and make reparation for our sins and those of the whole world. It is a powerful and effective way to thank Him for His gift of mercy to us and, at the same time, to be "merciful to Him" since the Lord continues to surer in His Body, the Church.

If, after an initial period of silent Adoration, you feel a desire to pray, or read, or write, then you simply allow yourself to move naturally into whatever activity you feel led to do at each moment.



You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
