"He said, 'Come.' Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus." Matthew 14:29

When you hear Jesus calling, do you respond immediately and trust that He knows what He's doing? If so, you are walking on water! When we say "yes" to Jesus, we feel the power of His presence in our lives. We can feel the freedom it gives us! Listen how Jesus is calling you to live the extraordinary life He has intended for you.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In the days before modern harbors a ship had to wait for the flood tide before it could make it to port. The term for this situation in Latin was "ob portu," that is, a ship standing over against port, waiting for the moment when it could ride the turn of the tide to harbor.

The English word "opportunity" is derived from this original meaning. The captain and crew were ready and waiting for that one moment, for they knew that if they missed it, they would have to wait for another tide to come in. Reflecting on this Latin origin of "opportunity" and its nautical foundation, William Shakespeare wrote,

There is a tide in the affairs of men, Which, taken at the flood, leads to fortune; Omitted, all the voyage of their life Is bound in shallows and in miseries. On such a full sea we are now afloat, And we mut take the current when it serves, Or lose our ventures.

St. Peter in today's Gospel is not going to miss his opportunity. While others in the boat cry out in fear and shriek, "It is a ghost," Peter implorers Jesus to allow him to approach the Lord by walking on the water, too. Here is Peter's chance, here is an extraordinary opportunity. Who knows if this opportunity would ever present itself again?

We know things didn't go well for Peter. There were doubts; he became frightened; he began to sink. Jesus had to stretch out his hand and save him. But still we can admire St. Peter's willingness to give it a go, to imitate Jesus.

"We must take the current when it serves," Shakespeare wrote. We must be ready to be like Jesus; we must be ready to be extraordinary. Or, as noted above, "Lose our ventures." In those days, that meant being stuck with product and materials on their ships rather than marketplaces, product that diminishes in value until it becomes worthless. The business venture becomes a loss.

For us, sitting in fear and doubt, staying in the boat, means that we will lose the blessings that may have come to us. We will not know fully the excitement of imitating Christ, we will not know the joy of accomplishing that which many thought could not be done. We may not walk on water, but one could answer the call to the priesthood and religious life, or one could decide not to cohabitate before marriage and stay pure, or one could make a large donation to church or charity rather than keep the money for self or one could defend the teachings of the Church when so many want to ridicule or ignore them. There are many ways and times when Jesus implores us to get out of the boat.

As mentioned, it didn't go well with St. Peter this time, but he recovered. It may be difficult for us, too, and sometimes we will fail. But this venture of faith for us will be profitable, even heavenly, if we do not miss the opportunity.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

On October 11, 1954, Pope Pius XII established the Feast of the Queenship of Mary to be celebrated throughout the world, and commanded that on that day each year, the world should renew its consecration to her. In the future the Feast came to be celebrated on August 22.

SAINT MAXIMILIAN KOLBE



Born Raymund Kolbe on January 8, 1894, in the Kingdom of Poland, part of the Russian Empire. He was very active in promoting the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary. Much of his life was strongly influenced by a vision

he had of the Virgin Mary when he was 12.

"That night I asked the Mother of God what was to become of me. Then she came to me holding two crowns, one white, the other red. She asked me if I was willing to accept either of these crowns. The white one meant that I should persevere in purity, and the red that I should become a martyr. I said that I would accept them both."

Things to know about Maximilian Kolbe:

- One year after his vision, Kolbe and his elder brother, Francis joined the Conventual Franciscans. In 1910, Kolbe was given the religious name Maximilian, after being allowed to enter the novitiate, and in 1911, he professed his vows. In 1918, he was ordained a priest.
- At the age of 21, Kolbe earned a doctorate in Philosophy from the Pontifical Gregorian University. He would also earn a doctorate in Theology by the time he was 28.
- He founded a religious group focused on evangelization. He opened a religious house near Warsaw, Niepokalanow—the City of the Immaculate, and later he traveled to Japan and opened another house in Nagasaki.
- He was master of the news media. He made use of the most modern printing technology and distribution strategies for his evangelization materials, his arsenal in the Militia's spiritual warfare. The friars started a radio station and Fr. Kolbe even had plans for a movie studio.
- Maximilian volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the German death camp of Auschwitz, located in German-occupied Poland during World War II.
- He was canonized October 10, 1982 by Pope John Paul II. The prisoner whom St. Maximilian saved in Auschwitz, Frnciszek Gajowniczek, was present at Maximilian's canonization
- St. Maximilian is the patron saint of families, prisoners, journalists, political prisoners, drug addicts and the pro-life movement.
