Our Heavenly Father gives us everything, including the chance to share in His eternal kingdom. Yet, like the Prodigal Son, we are often lured away by the materialism of our society. Do you really want to turn your back on all that God offers in exchange for material wealth that has no lasting value? God wants us to be happy on earth as well. But, that requires us to freely accept His gift of faith; putting Him first in all things and detaching from our own self-sufficiency.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

There's a great story about two United States Senators of the past, John Stennis, a Democrat from Mississippi, and Mark Hatfield, a Republican from Oregon. Senator Stennis was known as a "hawk." He was bullish on American involvement in Vietnam and he served as the powerful chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee. Senator Hatfield was described as a "dove." He had grown tired of the war in Vietnam and he frequently clashed with Senator Stennis over the spending of American tax dollars for the military.

On the cold night of January 30, 1973, Senator Stennis arrived home, parked his car, and headed from the driveway to the front door. Out of the darkness came two robbers, brandishing a pistol and demanding money. Stennis was robbed of his wallet, watch, and coins totaling twenty-five cents. Despite complying with the robber's demands, the senator was shot twice, once in the stomach and once in a leg. Doctors operated for more than six hours to save John Stennis' life.

While the senator was on the operating table, news bulletins about the crime became prominent on radio and television. One person who heard such a bulletin on his car radio was Senator Mark Hatfield. Though on the opposite side from Senator Stennis on many issues, Senator Hatfield admired his fellow legislator. Aware of the crises and wishing to do what he could. Hatfield turned his car toward the hospital. "I had no skills to offer," he would say, "but I knew this was something I must do - and that was to go to the hospital and be nearby where I could be helpful, if possible, to the family."

Chaos reigned at the hospital. Confusion abounded. There were a large number of police officers, a growing amount of senators and congressmen, and a noisy bunch of reporters and television crews. The hospital staff was overwhelmed, particularly those trying to answer all the incoming calls on the hospital's switchboard. Operators were doing their best to keep up, but they were understaffed and unprepared to handle such an emergency.

Sizing up the situation upon his arrival, Senator Hatfield quickly saw a place where he could help. Spotting an unattended switchboard, Hatfield sat down and told one of the harried operators, "I know how to work one of these. Let me help you." "Go ahead", he was told, and for the rest of the night, the senator became a telephone operator, answering calls and taking messages. He never told anyone - callers or operators, who he was. Finally, at dawn, Hatfield stood up, stretched, put on his coat, and at last introduced himself to his fellow workers. "My name is Hatfield," he told them, "and I was happy to help out on behalf of a man I deeply respect." Without fanfare, he headed for home.

The press, it has been said, couldn't handle the story when it leaked out. It boggled their minds. No way did it make sense for a Republican to help a Democrat, for a dove to lend assistance to a hawk. And beyond that, to spend the night helping in a seemingly menial, anonymous way! Politicians just don't act that way!

Christians do, however. Christians are part of the Body of Christ, bound to one another by Christ's Death and Resurrection, a bond that is cemented first in our baptism. One pastor described it as a glue of authentic love which expresses itself in compassion, fairness, willingness to support, and coming to the aid of another without strings attached. He described such a love with one word - bigness.

Bigness in love is what's on display in the parable of the Prodigal Son. The father in this story told by Jesus offers amazing love - to both sons. The younger son, selfish and naive, demanded his share of the inheritance and abandons his father. After making his life a wreck, this son comes home prepared to be a slave, but then he encounters the bigness of the father's love. He is welcomed home and a celebration begins.

The older son has always been around the bigness of his father's love but he, too, is selfish - and huffy. He's convinced that he should get more than he deserves. Despite this arrogance, his father still offers love, only love. Big love.

In today's First Reading, St. Paul writes to St. Timothy and remarks, "Indeed, the grace of our Lord has been abundant, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus." May the awareness Paul had be ours this day. May the example of people like Mark Hatfield inspire us. May the loving Father in the Gospel be an example to us. And may that one word describe our love, our service, our faith. Bigness.

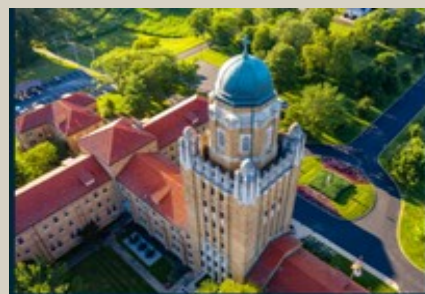
