FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

Corrie ten Boom was a member of a Christian family living in Amsterdam, Holland, during World Ward II. Practicing their faith, the ten Boom family allowed their home to be a hiding place for Jews and members of the Dutch Resistance. Betrayed, they were arrested and Corrie and her sister Betsie were sent to a concentration camp.

After the war, Corrie became an author and a speaker about her Christian faith, especially about the necessity of forgiveness. Mercy at times was difficult to share, as it once was written:

"Suddenly Corrie caught sight of him in the congregation at Munich - the former SS man who had been their guard at Ravensbruck camp. Somehow she managed to go on speaking, but scenes of horror and anguish from those days crowded into her mind. It was not for herself she cared - she remembered her poor sister, Betsie, ill, frail, yet made to strip while those mocking guards examined their prisoners. Now the leader of them was here in church.

After the service he came up the church toward her, smiling broadly and with outstretched hand, "Thank you for your message," he said, "Jesus has washed away my sin." Corrie looked at him unable to lift her hand from her side. She had preached forgiveness, but how could she show it to the very person who had humiliated and hurt her beloved sister? For a long moment she paused, still unable to shake his hand, and she prayed to Jesus to help her.

As she took the former guard's hand, Corrie felt an amazing current passing from herself to him and love filled her heart. So, she concluded, "I discovered that when God tells us to love our enemies, God gives, along with the command, the love itself." (Corrie's sister Betsie already knew that. Before her death in the camp, Betsie told Corrie, 'There is no pit so deep that God is not deeper still')."

The poor fellow in today's Gospel never learned that lesson, never examined the length and depth of God's love. How could he? He was too busy thinking about himself, how he could manipulate the master in order to receive mercy, how he could bully another servant who owed him money, how he could callously throw the man in prison. For this ungrateful person mercy only moved from one person to another, and then it stopped. No passing on, no spreading of God's love.

The Lord expects more of us. Like Corrie ten Boom said, God has given the command to love our enemies, indeed, to love all as we love our self. But the Lord did not leave us with no examples or resources to obey this command. The Lord supplies the love. May we never fail to share it.

Please join me in welcoming the two seminarians sent to help part-time at our parish. Unlike Jacob Braun, Will and Zach will live and study at the seminary and only come to Queen of All Saints a few hours a week. We are glad that they have been sent to us and we pray that God will guide them as they share their faith with us.



FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN

Fallen and Redeemed Man

Reflecting on the wounded and sinful state of man after Adam's

expulsion from the Garden of Eden, St. Anselm writes: "He [Adam] was satisfied to the full; we sigh with hunger. He had everything he needed; we go begging. He happily possessed those things and abandoned them in misery; we unhappily do without them and miserably desire them, but alas, we remain empty-handed. Why did he not preserve for us, as he could easily have done, what we so woefully lack? Why did he thus shut us out from the light and cover us with darkness? Why did he take away our life and inflict death upon us?"

With great poignancy, Anselm highlights the pitiful existence of man outside the walls of Eden. By disobeying God, Adam abandoned perfect happiness and friendship with his Creator. The progenitor of the human race thereby doomed his descendants to lives that begin with suffering and end in death. It is not hard to see why Anselm's reflection is tinged with anger and frustration.

In answer to man's infidelity, the Incarnate Son of God, Jesus Christ, chose to do more than help man climb back into Eden. Rather, Christ chose to endure pain, so that our pain might be imbued with purpose and meaning. By suffering, Jesus ensures that our own suffering can be redeemed, and oriented to supernatural ends. By becoming man and choosing to bear the agonies of a fallen world, Jesus not only restores man to a state of friendship with God, but makes it possible that human beings enjoy the privilege of adopted sonship. Of course, all of this requires tremendous grace, which man neither earns nor deserves, despite his noblest striving.

Thankfully, the means of salvation have already been given to us by Jesus Christ, who instituted the Seven Sacraments, which He entrusted to His Church. Over the next several weeks, I will be writing about the Sacraments — why they are necessary for salvation and what they do —starting with Baptism. I hope you all will find this brief series on the Sacraments helpful.



SACRAMENTS OF RECONCILIATION AND HOLY EUCHARIST

WHAT IS THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process of preparation whereby one inquires into the teachings of and pursues entrance into the Catholic Church. For each person, it is the journey through phases of maturation in Faith whereby one readies to commit oneself to Jesus Christ and His Church through seeking the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist/First Holy Communion).

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN RCIA CLASSES?

- •Any **Unbaptized** person seeking to know and encounter Jesus Christ, enter into his divine life through Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist, and follow him in a life of Christian discipleship. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith and initial conversion to Christ is called a *Catechumen*.
- •Any **Baptized** person from another Christian community seeking to *become Catholic and enter into full communion with Christ and His Church* through the reception of the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith, is called a *Candidate*.
- •Any **Baptized Catholic** looking to increase their devotion as a disciple of Jesus Christ through further study of the Faith or to complete their sacraments of initiation by receiving Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
