FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A well-known organist was performing a concert on the huge antique organ in the local church. The bellows were hand-pumped by a boy who was behind a screen, unseen by the audience. The first part of the performance was well received. The audience was thrilled by the organist's ability to bring beautiful and uplifting music from the old instrument. After hearing thunderous applause from the crowd, the organist announced an intermission and he walked proudly to a nearby room. As he left he heard the boy say, "We played well, didn't we, sir?"

Haughtily, the organist replied, "And what do you mean by 'we'?"

After the intermission, the organist returned to his seat at the impressive five-keyboard console and the congregation settled in their pews, ready to be inspired again. But nothing happened, not a sound was heard. The organist was frantic, but then heard a youthful whisper, "Say, mister, now do you know what 'we' means?"

Jesus in today's Gospel is teaching his disciples what "we" means, that is, all of us are important in the work of extending the Kingdom of God, even those who arrive at eleventh hour. Though late to assume their task, these workers put forth their best effort, though they worked but a single hour God shared His blessings with generosity. It's clear God appreciates our best effort.

Not everyone wants to do that. One man wrote about his college days and the boy next to him in the college orchestra who never made a mistake. All the other musicians had at one time or another been scolded by the professor. "You're coming in at the wrong time, "he would thunder. "Can't you read the music?" he would shout. All felt his wrath, except this one young man; he was never criticized for a mistake.

It was strange, then, when all of a sudden the flawless musician ceased coming to practice. The professor explained why, and why he had never scolded this particular musician. He did not play loud enough for the professor, or anyone else, to hear him. He had been content just to play along, minimizing his contribution to the music. He was glad to let others do the work.

The laborers in the parable Jesus told were not like that. They wanted to work, they wanted to contribute, and they were willing to wait all day for that to happen. Their desire was pleasing to God.

Our desire should match theirs, even if we are late in coming. The Lord calls us to do our part, to join together as disciples of Christ as members of His Church, to know what "we" means. The owner in the parable was generous to his workers. God will be generous to us.

Baptism: Why We Need It And What It Does

As fallen human beings, born into the world separated from God's grace by Original Sin, Baptism is of the utmost importance. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments." The importance of this Sacrament is expressed by Christ himself, who says to Nicodemus (John 3:5), "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit." Strikingly, the Catechism emphasizes that for those to whom the Gospel has been preached, "the Church does not know of any means other than Baptism that assures entry into eternal beatitude..."

So, what does Baptism do for us?

In short, Baptism has two principle effects: It infuses the soul with sanctifying grace and it leaves an indelible mark, a sacramental character, on the soul of the recipient. For adults who receive Baptism, the infusion of grace involves not only the washing away of Original sin but also the forgiveness of all personal sins up to the point of Baptism. Because infants and children below the age of reason have no personal sin or guilt, their Baptism simply washes away Original Sin by filling their souls with sanctifying grace. So, if Baptism forgives sins, why not just get Baptized over and over, thus eliminating the need for Reconciliation? The answer to that question lies in sacramental character.

When an unbaptized person receives the Sacrament of Baptism, a permanent mark, referred to as the sacramental character, is left on the soul. This mark, though invisible to our eyes, configures baptized persons after Jesus himself, and enables Christians to have a "vital participation in the holy liturgy of the Church" while helping them to live holy lives with "practical charity." Because of this indelible sacramental character, a Baptized person is forever marked as a member of the Catholic Church. No sin or failing or renunciation in this life can erase or undo this spiritual reality. Because of this baptismal seal, a person can only be baptized once, and any personal sins that follow Baptism must be forgiven by other means. In the following weeks, as we continue to dive into the Sacraments, we will discuss how the other sacraments sustain us in and restore us to grace when we sin after Baptism.



WHAT IS THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process of preparation whereby one inquires into the teachings of and pursues entrance into the Catholic Church. For each person, it is the journey through phases of maturation in Faith whereby one readies to commit oneself to Jesus Christ and His Church through seeking the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist/First Holy Communion).


WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN RCIA CLASSES?

- •Any **Unbaptized** person seeking to know and encounter Jesus Christ, enter into his divine life through Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist, and follow him in a life of Christian discipleship. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith and initial conversion to Christ is called a *Catechumen*.
- •Any **Baptized** person from another Christian community seeking to *become Catholic and enter into full communion with Christ and His Church* through the reception of the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith, is called a *Candidate*.
- •Any **Baptized Catholic** looking to increase their devotion as a disciple of Jesus Christ through further study of the Faith or to complete their sacraments of initiation by receiving Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
