In other words, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

The priests recently received some statistics from the Archdiocese informing us of the number of Catholics in the Archdiocese and where these Catholics once resided, and where they reside now. For instance, in 1950 the South City Deanery had 49 parishes for 128,330 Catholics. In 2020 that same deanery had but 26 parishes for 34,460 Catholics. Quite a drop in parishes and Catholics! Conversely, in 1950 the St. Charles Deanery had only 17 parishes

for just 12,300 Catholics. Today in St. Charles there are 23 parishes for 101,000 Catholics. It's not hard to discern population shifts when one looks at the figures presented.

Such information was sent to us as the archdiocese begins a study to evaluate our resources along with the number of priests we have to staff our parishes. Already we have seen many changes in recent years. In 1930 this archdiocese had 203 parishes, now we have 178. Some churches have closed for good, some parishes have merged with other parishes. Study will soon begin to determine if more closings and/or mergers are necessary.

Particularly upsetting about the figures are numbers estimating unregistered Catholics, i.e. people not signed up in any parish, and the total reported Catholics in the archdiocese. In 1960 the estimated number of unregistered Catholics was 2,000. Today, it's 75,000. The total of all Catholics peaked in 1990 at 535,400. Sadly, today that number has dipped under 500,000 for the first time in fifty years. The trends are not promising.

But the Catholic faith is promising, along with hopeful, glorious, and redemptive. Some people just don't know that - and it's your job to tell them. You see, many of you have more contact with the unbaptized or the non-Catholics than we in the rectory do. Most of the people we see every day or each week are Catholic, some devout, some struggling. But you, in your family and neighborhoods certainly would have more contact with non-Catholics or the non-baptized. Perhaps it's someone who married into your family. Maybe it's the couple who moved in next door. It could be someone in the group at work with whom you have lunch five days a week or who sits next to you while your children practice a sport. Should you be the person who invites them to consider the Catholic faith? Yes. Should you be the one who informs them that at your parish - at Queen of All Saints - there are a group of people eager to join them in a journey of faith that may result in their Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation? Yes.

Faithful members of our parish compose the group that leads the program called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults - R.C.I.A.

These parishioners, along with Fr. Detwiler and myself, are ready to share the beauty of our Catholic faith with your neighbor, friend, or relative. All they need is for you to point them in the right direction, even offer to come with them. You know that Jesus sent his disciples out to share the news of the Kingdom of God and you know those disciples went with great hast, even when to speak of Christ put them in mortal danger. Today, you and I have the responsibility to speak of Jesus Christ and invite others to join His flock. Watch the bulletin for information about the RCIA. Invite one, or more, people to check it out. And pray for the courage to do so. Those sad numbers listed above won't change for the better unless we offer the good news of our wonderful Catholic faith to others.

Go to https://www.preventandprotectstl.org

Click "Register" below the LOG IN button (image at right).

Enter the passcode stiprotect when prompted.

Select the type of location where you are a volunteer or employee.

- *Parish or Parish School
- *Non-Parish School or Program
- *Archdiocesan Agency
- *Non-Archdiocesan Organization

Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

If you are active at only one location, this will be your "primary" location.

If you are active at more than one location, click the ADD PARISH/LOCATION button and repeat the steps above. With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

Complete your personal information. Please enter your legal first name (no nicknames) for the purpose of the background screening.

Create a username, password and password clue. ****(BE SURE TO SAVE THIS INFORMATION TO AVOID RE-REGISTERING. DOUBLE BACKGROUND CHECKS ARE COSTLY TO OUR PARISH!!!)

Agree to the Terms of Use and click SUBMIT.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.


