FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The parishioner had been asked to give a talk at a parish retreat but he couldn't get his thoughts together. Increasingly frustrated and spiritually stymied, he decided to go to the local diner and get a cup of coffee. Though the hour was late, he hoped that being around other people might provide some kind of inspiration.

While seated at the counter, three men came in - loud, dirty, bums, the parishioner thought. One of the three loudly announced, "Tomorrow's my birthday." Another said, "So what." The three had a donut and a cup of coffee and left.

After they left, the man asked the waitress, "Do these guys come in here all the time?" She said, "Yes, they come in every morning about one o'clock. They work second shift at some factory, some kind of job that obviously get them dirty. "The parishioner asked if they would be in the next night at 1 a.m., on the guy's birthday. "I'm sure they will be, they're in every morning," she replied.

The next day, the parishioner called some friends and they arranged to throw a surprise party for the man, whose name they did not know. They bought decorations and hung them around the diner. They arranged with the waitress for lots of food to be ready at one o'clock, and they purchased a special birthday cake. When the three dirty workers arrived at the usual time, the diner was full of people who shouted, "Surprise!"

The birthday boy was overwhelmed, moved, and speechless. When he finally spoke, his words were choked with emotion. He asked if he could take the entire cake home. He wanted to sit and just look at it. It was the first time in his life he had been given a birthday cake.

After introductions were made, food eaten, and the party was over, the waitress came to the parishioner and said, "I bet you belong to some church." "Yes," came the response, "I belong to a church that throws birthday parties for a down-on-his-luck guy at one o'clock in the morning." The waitress said, "I want to join that church."

I hope today's Walk for the Poor evokes the same thought from those who see it. We can be thankful that our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society has organized today's walk, allowing us to give witness to our community that we are a people - a parish - that cares for others, especially the poor. Not only do we get to wear cool shirts as a sign of our commitment to the poor, we also get to donate money, food, coupons and clothing to help those in difficult situations. Best of all, the good we do today in the Walk for the Poor remains with us forever.

Back in the third century St. Cyprian wrote, "Charity is the bond of brotherhood, the foundation of peace, the steadfastness and firmness of unity; it is greater than both faith and hope, it excels both good works and suffering for the faith; and, as eternal virtue, it will abide with us forever in the kingdom of heaven." That makes today a big deal, something attached to us into eternity. Today's walk helps the poor; it also helps us on our journey to God.

Steadfastness, firmness, the foundation of peace, the bond of brotherhood are on display today. "I'll bet you belong to some church" receives an answer from the St. Vincent de Paul Society and Queen of All Saints Parish.

Dear Friends in Christ.

The call to be deacon is to serve. On Sunday, October 4, 2020, there will be a special collection for the formation of permanent deacons in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. This collection relieves some of their financial burden for studies to become a deacon. Since 1977, 487 men have been ordained as permanent deacons in the Archdiocese. There are 211 active deacons ordained for the Archdiocese and 102 retired deacons. There are 44 men in formation at this time. When the permanent diaconate program was initiated in the Archdiocese in January 1977, men went through a two-year formation program, with a third year of post-ordination formation. Since then, the program has gradually expanded to five years of formation, plus three more years of postordination formation. Deacons serve in parishes, hospitals, archdiocesan agencies, and other organizations. They offer their time, talent and energy to strengthen our church in St. Louis and do not receive compensation for their work. Their service extends into many areas of parish life, including the proclamation of the Gospel, liturgical functions, administration, and charitable works. Many active deacons continue to be employed fulltime, requiring them to balance family lives and professions with their ministry as a deacon.

Confirmation: A Sacrament of Initiation

Along with Baptism and the Holy Eucharist, Confirmation is one of the

three Sacraments of Initiation. Until more recent history, all three of these Sacraments were given to infants on the same day. In fact, many Eastern Rite Catholics still receive the Sacraments in that order, with Reconciliation coming only after the children have reached the age of reason. Putting aside historical and pastoral reasons for why the Sacrament of Confirmation is generally received sometime after 7th grade in the U.S., it is worth investigating the purpose and effects of this amazing Sacrament.

What is Confirmation For?

According to a document from the Second Vatican Council called *Lumen Gentium*, Baptized Christians "are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Like the Apostles at Pentecost, those who are Confirmed receive not only a mission from Christ, to be his disciples on earth, but also the strength to carry out that mission. *Lumen Gentium* continues, "Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." Confirmation represents, and causes, the spiritual growth into maturity and strength that precedes true discipleship. As disciples of Jesus, those who are Confirmed are commissioned to be living signs of Jesus Christ's redeeming mission to a world that is desperately in need of redemption.

The Effects of Confirmation

Like the Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation leaves an indelible mark on the soul of the recipient. But, there are many other effects from the Sacrament of Confirmation, which serve to both deepen the graces received at Baptism and give us the same graces that the Apostles received at Pentecost. St. Ambrose puts it well, when he says to those who have been Confirmed, "Recall then that you have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence, the spirit of holy fear in God's presence. Guard what you have received. God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts." By Confirmation, we are not only more closely united with all three Persons of the Holy Trinity in grace, but we are also given the task of publicly witnessing to the reality of Jesus Christ, who lived, died, and rose for us. With the special graces of this Sacrament, we are also given the strength to carry out this task.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
