FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Jesuit Father William Byron, at one time President of Catholic University, penned these words:

"I know a business professor who puts the following question on his midterm examination: 'What is the name of the worker who cleans this classroom and the corridor outside?' His response to the howls of protest from angry students: 'I'm preparing you to become a good employer. If you don't know the little people by name, you won't be providing good leadership in your organization. And if you think the question was unfair, I'll make it up to you by telling you now that the exact same question will be on the final exam!'

"On Labor Day think about the work you do. Be grateful for all the gifts that enable you to do it. Think about the workers who stand behind so many of the products and services you tend to take for granted. Think of those who are unemployed or on the margins of the workforce in lowpaying jobs. Well beyond our borders are those who are trapped between misery and workplace exploitation. Labor Day prayer might open up the question of what we can do to make the world of work a better place for all of them."

The prophet Ezekiel in today's First Reading is given work by God. "You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel," says the Lord. It will be the prophet's job to keep close watch for danger - the danger being disobedience towards God - and to warn the people they are in danger. Ezekiel accepts his task and boldly proclaims the ways of God, informing the wicked people they are heading for destruction. It surely wasn't the easiest of jobs, or the most glamorous, or the one that brought personal wealth. But it was a good job because it came from God.

Over a thousand years ago St. Benedict taught his monks "Laborare est orare," - "to work is to pray." The vocations we have, the calling we received, and the work we do should mean so much more to us than a paycheck. Our work's foundation is not in our education or skill, but in our hearts. There the Lord instructs us and encourages us to make whatever we do to earn a living a holy action, a job that comes from God. Each day each worker has the opportunity to make the world a better place, to be aware of those who work with us or near us, and to watch for chances where we can bring to others the love Christ brings to us.

Labor Day, especially in 2020, also demands that we pray for the millions out-of-work in this time of pandemic. May God hear our prayers, bring relief to our suffering world, and guide everybody to work which is pleasing to Him. Happy Labor Day!

From the Desk of Our Seminarian

FORM MATTERS

You may have heard about the priest from the Archdiocese of Detroit, who learned that he was invalidly baptized as an infant by a deacon, who said



"We Baptize..." instead of "I Baptize..." With the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith confirming that the change of this single word invalidates this priest's Baptism, and consequently all of his other sacraments, it is worth investigating what makes a sacrament valid.

Conditions for Valid Sacraments

The outward sign of every sacrament is composed of four things: *matter, form*, minister, and recipient. In the Baptism of this Detroit priest, almost everything was done correctly: the Deacon, as the proper minister, poured water over the head of the proper recipient, i.e., an unbaptized person. The problem is that the deacon changed one of the words of the Baptismal formula, meaning that the proper *form* was not utilized. When this happens, there is no sacrament. So, what are *matter* and *form*?

Matter

The *matter* of a sacrament is made up of "material elements and sensible gestures." For Baptism, the "material element" is the water that is used for the sacrament. The "sensible gesture" would be the action of pouring water over the head of the recipient. But these elements and actions are not enough on their own to convey the full spiritual meaning of the sacrament. For that, we need what is called the *form* of the sacrament.

<u>Form</u>

The *form* of a sacraments is given by words that make explicit the meaning of the sensible elements and gestures. In the case of Baptism, the proper *form* is for the minister to say, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." By saying this, the minister "enacts ministerially the sign-presence of Christ, who acts in his Body (the Church) to give his grace. . ." To say "We baptize you," instead of "I baptize you" is to obscure the reality that it is Jesus Christ who baptizes, rather than us. It is Jesus Christ who infuses human souls with grace and lifts them from the stupor of sin. To some, this may look like liturgical quibbling at first glance, but attentiveness to sacramental *form* is absolutely crucial for the life of the Church.

WHAT IS THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process of preparation whereby one inquires into the teachings of and pursues entrance into the Catholic Church. For each person, it is the journey through phases of maturation in Faith whereby one readies to commit oneself to Jesus Christ and His Church through seeking the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist/First Holy Communion).

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN RCIA CLASSES?

- Any **Unbaptized** person seeking to know and encounter Jesus Christ, enter into his divine life through Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist, and follow him in a life of Christian discipleship. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith and initial conversion to Christ is called a *Catechumen*.
- Any **Baptized** person from another Christian community seeking to *become Catholic and enter into full communion with Christ and His Church* through the reception of the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Such a person, after a period of inquiry into the faith, is called a *Candidate*.
- Any Baptized Catholic looking to increase their devotion as a disciple of Jesus Christ through further study of the Faith or to complete their sacraments of initiation by receiving Confirmation and/or First Holy Communion.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS AT NO COST TO YOU!

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)
