

FROM OUR PASTOR

Secret Santas Needed!

Queen of All Saints parishioners have always been generous, especially during the Christmas season helping the poor and needy. I would like to ask you to help with something closer to home. Rob Rixford and Ray Barton are our maintenance men who keep our parish buildings clean and in shape. They both spend a lot of time fixing things and cleaning the floors in church, in the church basement and in the school cafeteria. When we tore out the carpet in church and put in vinyl flooring they could no longer clean the floor simply by using a vacuum cleaner. They need to use a device called a "floor scrubber". In the past they have borrowed a floor scrubber from a cleaning company, but it is not always available when they need it. We would like to get a floor scrubber for the parish but it is not in the budget for next year. And so, I would like to ask parishioners if they could help pay

for this device by making whatever contribution you can. The cost is around \$3000. I'll keep running reminders in the bulletin as long as it takes until we collect enough for the purchase. This is a voluntary contribution, do not feel bad if you are unable to help at this time. But for those of you who are blessed and feel generous and like seeing clean floors, put your contribution in an envelope marked "Floor Scrubber" and mail or drop it off at the rectory or drop it in the collection on Sunday. I don't want to ask anything from all of you if I'm not willing to contribute myself, so I'll start things off by writing a check for \$100 as soon as I finish this article. In the event that we collect more than what is needed to pay for the device, we'll apply the excess contributions towards replacing the outdated computers that our secretaries are currently using. I included a picture of the device that we would like to get. Thank you for your generosity!


BAPTISMAL PREPARATION


Advent Holy Hour

Please check here if you wish to pay the full \$350 rather than use Parish funds.





St. Louis Sluggers Improve Mobility With Donor Help

Richard M., housebound due to health conditions for over 2 years, is now able to leave home for all-important appointments – and occasional sightseeing trips with family – thanks to our St. Louis Sluggers.

Established in 2006 in response to Hurricane Katrina, these volunteers – Queen of All Saints parishioners and friends – perform in the ministry of St. Vincent de Paul. They provide construction services to those affected by natural disasters, and make needed repairs for community non-profit organizations, senior citizens and those with disabilities. Wherever, whenever they can.









In this case, the networking of charitable minds and hearts brought a new dawn for this Lemay resident. His former physical therapist, QAS parishioner Kim Duprey, saw the notice in the parish bulletin that a disability ramp was received, disassembled and stored by the Sluggers. She reached out, but that ramp had already been reserved. She persisted, and when another ramp was donated, her former client got the call.

On a sunny November day, the Sluggers used their considerable construction, mechanical and engineering skills from diverse professional backgrounds to make painstaking adjustments and securely install the ramp for Mr. M.
