"For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

MATTHEW 5:20

The Pharisees lived according to the letter of the law and they used this to elevate themselves above the other people. Jesus is clear – it's the love that you have in your heart, for God and others, that will get you to heaven. Simply following church rules to the letter and not out of love, does not necessarily put you on the path to heaven. Attending Sunday Mass and then gossiping about a fellow parishioner on the parking lot is an example of being a modern day Pharisee.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The story is told of a farmer who had lived on the same farm all his life. It was a good farm with fertile soil, but with the passing of years, the farmer began to think, "Maybe there's something better for me." He set out to find an even better plot of land to farm.

Every day he found a new reason for criticizing some feature of his old farm. Finally, he decided to sell it. He listed the farm with a real estate agent who promptly prepared an advertisement emphasizing all the many advantages of the farm: ideal location, modern equipment, healthy stock, acres of fertile ground, high yield on crops, well-kept barns and pens, and a nice two-story house on a hill overlooking the pasture.

When the realtor called to read the ad for final approval before publication, the farmer listened intently, and surprised himself with his reaction. "Hold everything!" He exclaimed. "I've changed my mind. My property sounds like a great place, the kind of place I've been looking for all my life."

When you start to identify the good traits of any person, situation or organization, you are likely to find that they far outweigh the bad. One should always focus on what one has. What one doesn't have will likely then seem insignificant.

The Commandments of God likewise should be worthy of focus. Today, the Book of Sirach reminds us, "If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you; if you trust in God, you too shall live." The Lord in his love has given the commandments to a people he has chosen for his own, commands that will guide and direct, that will protect and save. Blessed are those who appreciate what God has done.

Yet, like the farmer above, too many are not content with God's commandments. Too many want to ignore them, or alter them, or change them to fit their circumstance. Too many do not value the wisdom of the Commandments or the care with which God crafted them. Lots of people look for loopholes, or just make them up. Jesus warns against such foolishness. One who think God's way can be altered to fit a personal lifestyle is getting information from the evil one, who is never a good source for information, or anything else.

Perhaps the hen could set a good example for us. Hard works means nothing to a hen. Regardless of what the market says about the price of eggs...regardless of what others expect of her...regardless of the fluctuations in the weather...she keeps on digging and laying eggs.

If the ground is hard, she scratches harder.

If it's dry, she digs deeper.

If it's wet, she digs where it's dry.

If she strikes a rock, she digs around it.

If she gets a few more hours of daylight, she digs for a few more hours.

Have you ever seen a pessimistic hen?

Have you ever seen a hen cackle in disgust at the prospect of her job?

Did you ever hear one cluck because the work was too hard, the conditions

were poor, or some of her eggs were taken?

No!

Let us appreciate what we have, especially as found it the beauty of the Commandments of God. Let our "yes" mean "yes" and our "no" mean "no" as we hear the words of Jesus today. May we work as hard as the hen.

Last week the priest of the Archdiocese learned that many changes have been made to the All Things New plan. Before, the archdiocese intended to close and/or merge dozens of parishes. That idea has been scrapped. Now, the plan calls for establishing nearly 100 pastorates, or grouping of parishes. The parishes in the pastorates will remain open - as long as they are able. Each pastorate will have only one pastor and he will be responsible for anywhere from one to five parishes. Oftentimes, at least for now, the pastor will be assisted by another priest. Parishes will keep their individual Finance Council (that's required by Church law) but they will have a common Parish Council, along with other organizations like St. Vincent de Paul Societies, Athletic Associations, Scout programs, men or women's clubs, etc. Parishes will also have changes in their Mass schedules and may have only one Mass in their church per weekend.

Queen of All Saints will still be a stand alone parish and for now will keep two priests. Our school will stay as it is, also. Check the All Things New website for pastorate groupings throughout the archdiocese and pray for the success of this plan.






