FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Fr. Brian Cavanaugh wrote a story of courage that he believes captures the essence of the indomitable spirit found at the Olympic Games. This moment of inspiration occurred at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona.

Derek Redmond of Great Britain lined up for a qualifying heat of the 400 meter run. Redmond was the holder of the British record in this event and had won numerous races, both as an individual and as a member of relay teams. In fact, Redmond and his British teammates had shocked everybody when they had beaten the Americans in the 4x400 meter relay at the World Championships in 1991. Now Redmond found himself speeding around the opening curve and preparing to pick up more speed on the backstretch. Then, disaster. Redmond suddenly crashed into the track, writhing in pain and clutching his right hamstring. Sprawled on the track, he lay helpless as the other runners continued on; Redmond's dream of Olympic Gold was over. Nevertheless, he couldn't quit. He couldn't give up. He struggled to his feet and awkwardly began hopping down the backstretch, dragging his injured leg, grimacing in pain.

Spectators then noticed an older man dash past security onto the track, running toward Derek Redmond. The man attempted to put his arm around the runner, but Redmond pushed him away. But the man continued along with Redmond until the excruciating pain overcame the athlete and he slumped into the man's outstretched arms. The older man helped the runner stand, and, arm in arm, they continued down the track with the crowd roaring their support. The older man was Jim Redmond, Derek's father.

Jim Redmond supported his son throughout his athletic career and would not abandon Derek now, not in this moment of suffering. No, together they would finish this race, which they did in five minutes, way behind everyone else. (At the Olympic level you come in last place if you run the 400 meters in 46 seconds).

Reporters swarmed over Jim Redmond for his comments after his son was helped off the track by the medical staff. The elder Redmond told the gathered press, "I'm more proud of my son now than if he had won the race."

The Redmonds, father and son, exemplified the Olympic spirit as proclaimed by the founder of the modern Olympic Games, Baron de Coubertin, in 1896: "The most important thing in the Olympic Games is not to win, but to take part; just as the most important thing in life is not the triumph, but the struggle."

"Bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God," St. Paul implores St. Timothy in what is today's Second Reading. Certainly in this Season of Lent the notion of sacrifice is close to us, as is the willingness to help one another. St. Paul was one who knew St. Timothy was facing difficult circumstances, after all, it was Paul who sent Timothy to mission territories. Paul himself certainly had experienced many trials and tribulations, and had been beaten severely because of his faith, so badly on one occasion that his attackers left him, thinking him dead. Yes, hardships were part of the life of a Christian.

Yet, we do not bear them alone, but with the strength which comes from God, that's a lot of strength. The power of it is seen in today's Gospel. Prior to this transfiguration scene, Jesus has told his Apostles that he is going to Jerusalem, where he will be arrested and executed. This is terribly upsetting to them. Now, though, on the mountain top, Jesus is transfigured, his face shines like the sun, his clothes are dazzling, and his Heavenly Father gives approval. Like Jim Redmond jumping from the stands, the Father is present to Jesus. And to Peter, James, and John. And to us. What a comfort! What a boost! What an encouragement to keep going during the Season of Lent, and all the way to the finishing line in God's Eternal Kingdom.

Now that both the women's and men's ACTS retreats have been completed I want to thank all those who did so much to make those weekends a special, sacred time for the retreatants. Well done!





STATIONS OF THE CROSS


