

Human Being Recall Notice!

NOTE TO EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS

Please remember to purify your Pyx. Especially if you have to fracture a host, there could be small particles left in your Pyx. Put water in your Pyx and consume it so no particles remain. Also, when bringing the Eucharist to the homebound or sick, bring a small white purificator, which you can get in the sacristy, in case someone spits out part of the host. The residue will need to be put in a cup of water and brought to a Priest or Deacon, who will take it to the sacristy for proper disposition.



MISSION APPEAL

On the weekend of June 15 & 16 we will have the Annual Mission Appeal in our parish. Fr. Jomon **Palatty** from the missionaries of St. Francis de Sales will be the speaker of this appeal. In the homily he will speak about their mission work mainly in India and several African countries. The congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales was founded in Annecy, France in 1837 as missionaries. They are now globally present in 29 counties with membership of more than 1500 priests. The missionaries work among the poor, disadvantaged, marginalized, and illiterate through conducting children's homes, orphanages and schools. More than 3500 economically poor, semi orphan or orphan children are cared for and educated in their 93 children's homes both in India and Africa. Also, we have to take care of retired priests, who retire only when they are not able to work anymore. There is absolutely no income from social security or any kind of welfare system. The elderly priests depend 100 percent on the congregation for support in their old age. So, please support the missionaries with you generous donations to continue the good work they are doing. Let us welcome our missionary Fr. Jomon Palatty msfs from India.

ANNUAL BABY BOTTLE DRIVE



The annual baby bottle drive is under way with donations to be collected on Father's Day weekend. All donations go to the **South County Help Center**. Besides offering free pregnancy tests, did you know this amazing organization offers support throughout the entire pregnancy? Expectant parents can participate

in the Earn While You Learn program which offers prenatal and parenting classes. Clients may take classes designed to fit their current stage of pregnancy and ear material items with each completed course. These items include diapers, wipes, clothing, formula, breastfeeding supplies and more. The men are able to attend Fatherhood Academy when they meet with a Male Mentor and take classes tailored to them. The South County Pregnancy Help Center not only cared for the unborn, but compassionately cares for the well-being of the women as well as the men.



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP - THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) - THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast began with St. Juliana, a young Belgian nun in the thirteenth century, who received in prayer an inspiration for a feast that would celebrate and promote the gift of the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This feast would eventually spread throughout the province, continent and the world. Corpus Christi and its accompanying procession with the Blessed Sacrament, celebrating the sacrament and signifying God's presence in our world and in our lives and reminding us of our common pilgrimage to Heaven, is a prayerful and edifying act of the entire Church. As a general rule, devotions are not mentioned in the Code of Canon Law. However, because of the importance of this devotion in the life of the Church, Canon 944 mentions it: "When it can be done in the judgement of the diocesan bishop, as a public witness of the veneration toward the Most Holy Eucharist, a procession is to be conducted through the public streets, especially on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ." On this feast, we can express our gratitude for the opportunity to receive our Lord every Sunday in the Eucharist to adore Him in prayer, and to show Him to the rest of the world in the streets of our archdiocese. archstl.org/dynamic

Fr. Rolheiser, author of "Bruised and Wounded," will offer insights to help us remove the taboo of suicide and to reclaim the memory of our loved ones.


